

Central Valley Water Board Tribal Beneficial Uses Update Meeting: Friday, October 9, 2026 | 1:00 PM-3:00 PM

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) invites tribes, tribal organizations, and tribal representatives to attend the upcoming Tribal Beneficial Uses (TBU) Update Meeting on **October 9, 2026, from 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM**. The meeting will be held in-person, with an option to participate remotely via videoconference or call-in.

The purpose of this meeting is to:

- Share background on the TBU project for newly-involved tribes.
- Update tribes on the status of the Basin Plan Amendment to designate TBU to the region's high-quality waterbody segments.
- Continue the discussion of the TBU designation process by soliciting further tribal input to incorporate into the development of the designation process.
- Provide an opportunity for tribes to ask questions about the TBU designation process.
