State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board or Board) staff will hold an informational public workshop to discuss Drought and Conservation Reporting (Reporting). State Water Board staff will discuss the Drought and Conservation Reporting's background and requirements, upcoming enhancements to the Reporting, and technical issues with the SAFER Clearinghouse.

WORKSHOP PURPOSE

Board staff will discuss and receive feedback from the Drought and Conservation Reporting's background and reporting, upcoming enhancements to the Reporting, and review technical issues with the SAFER Clearinghouse.

BACKGROUND

Community water systems and non-transient non-community water systems that are schools are required to submit Drought and Conservation Reports to the State Water Board Division of Drinking Water. The State Water Board, in consultation with the California Public Utilities Commission and other state agencies, has developed a reporting platform to streamline drought and conservation data reporting from public drinking water systems. The SAFER Clearinghouse is the reporting platform used to submit this data.

Community water systems and non-transient noncommunity water systems that are schools are required to submit monthly reports as part of the Drought and Conservation reporting at a quarterly frequency. Water systems that are experiencing a severe water shortage, or systems that have been identified by the State Water Board or Local Primacy Agency staff to be at-risk of experiencing a severe water shortage may be required to submit drought-related data more frequently to the State to facilitate better coordination of assistance and emergency tracking.

Urban Retail Water Suppliers are required to submit monthly reports on a monthly basis in accordance with current Monthly Conservation Reporting requirements.
