Subject: FEBRUARY 1 WEEKLY UPDATE ON CURTAILMENT STATUS OF WATER RIGHTS AND CLAIMS IN THE DELTA WATERSHED – REIMPOSITION OF CURTAILMENTS ON SOME TRIBUTARIES

This email contains important information about the curtailment status of water rights and claims of right within the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta (Delta) watershed pursuant to orders that were issued on August 20, 2021 ([Order for water rights/claims under 5,000 acre-feet](#) and [Order for water rights/claims over 5,000 acre-feet](#)).

Based on recent water supply forecasts, **curtailment statuses have been updated to reimpose curtailments in some subwatersheds starting Wednesday, February 2, 2022.** Water supply forecasts will continue to be evaluated regularly to determine if, when, and to what extent the further re-imposition or suspension of curtailments may be appropriate, and the next curtailment status update will be provided by email and web posting no later than February 8, 2022. Please check the [Delta Watershed Curtailment Status List](#) for the current curtailment status of each water right and claim in the Delta watershed.

The following priorities of right are **curtailed effective tomorrow, February 2, 2022,** unless and until the State Water Board advises that this determination has been updated:

1. Water rights and claims on the following [Sacramento River](#) tributaries:
 - a. Post-1914 appropriative water rights and pre-1914 appropriative water right claims in the [Cache Creek](#) subwatershed with a priority date of 1856 or later;
 - b. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the [Stony Creek](#) subwatershed with a priority date of 1921 or later; and
 - c. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the [Putah Creek](#) subwatershed outside of the Legal Delta with a priority date of 1945 or later.
2. Water rights and claims on the following [San Joaquin River](#) tributaries:
 - a. Post-1914 appropriative water rights and pre-1914 appropriative water right claims in the [Fresno River](#) subwatershed with a priority date of 1873 or later;
 - b. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the [Mokelumne River](#) subwatershed outside of the Legal Delta with a priority date of 1949 or later;
 - c. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the [Calaveras River](#) subwatershed outside of the Legal Delta with a priority date of 1959 or later; and
 - d. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the [Chowchilla River](#) subwatershed with a priority date of 1959 or later.

Available water supplies from precipitation events in December have declined following a historically warm and dry January, resulting in the re-imposition of curtailments in

multiple subwatersheds. The decision to re-impose curtailments is based on water supply forecasts from the California Nevada River Forecast Center (CNRFC) that were updated on February 1, 2022, as well as forecasts from the California Department of Water Resources (DWR). The 75% exceedance water supply forecast was selected to determine curtailments at this time due to prolonged dry conditions observed throughout the Delta watershed during the month of January. Curtailment statuses will be reassessed next week (or earlier if appropriate) based on daily water supply observations and updated forecasts. Demand data informing curtailments continue to be based on reported diversions from 2018.

Water right holders and claimants are responsible for monitoring their curtailment status online on the [Delta Watershed Curtailment Status List](#). Notice of changes to curtailment status will not be mailed. For those with limited internet access, a pre-recorded curtailment summary can be heard on the Delta Curtailment Status phone line at (916) 323-4643.
