

On Monday, June 22, 2015, the following reply email was sent to 104 recipients who submitted comments to the State Water Resources Control Board between June 8 and June 22 regarding actions being taken by the Central Valley Project to maintain temperature control for salmonid fisheries in the Sacramento River below Shasta Dam during the drought:

Thank you for your correspondence to the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) regarding Sacramento River temperature-related issues. Your comment and others have been posted on the State Water Board's website and are being reviewed by Board members and staff, and considered in this matter. We appreciate your input and understand the various water supply, fisheries and other concerns that have been raised by you and others. We will continue to carefully consider those concerns as we move forward with operational decisions this year and in the future.
