Density and Site Selection Elements				
Minimum Lot Size	County's minimum lot size is ½ acre for subdivisions approved after the LAMP effective date. The local agency does not specify a minimum lot size for parcels of record as of the LAMP approval date.	Town's minimum lot size is <u>½</u> ¹ acre for subdivisions approved <u>on or after</u> the LAMP effective date <u>January 11, 2006</u> . For lots of record before the LAMP effective date <u>January 11, 2006</u> , the Town brings over the Basin Plan criteria of ½ acre after ~1988 and 15,000 ft ² before ~1988.	Town's LAMP is slightly more protective	Town's LAMP is slightly more protective because the Town <u>incorporated the existing Basin Plan density criteria directly into the LAMP minimum lot size for subdivisions approved on or after January 11, 2006 is one acres, twice as large as the</u> C <u>ounty's</u> .
