**AMENDED CLEANUP AND ABATEMENT ORDER NO. R6T-2002-0004-A1
WDID NO. 6A290007NO3**

**Requiring Oliver Cross to
the Effects of Clean Up and Abate the Discharge of
Petroleum Products to the Ground Waters of the
Truckee River Hydrologic Unit at the Pat & Ollies – Gateway Gasoline Station,
10115 Donner Pass Road, Truckee, Nevada County
Assessors Parcel Number 19-092-04**

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Lahontan Region (Regional Board) finds:

1. The CAO No. R6T-2002-0004 for the Pat & Ollies – Gateway at 11015 Donner Pass Road in Truckee was adopted on January 18, 2002.
2. Based on the current site progress, amendments to reduce and/or modify the reporting frequency in the CAO are warranted.
3. This enforcement action is being taken by this regulatory agency to enforce the provisions of the California Water Code and as such is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et. Seq.) in accordance with section 15321, Chapter 3, Title 14, of the California Code of Regulations.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that pursuant to California Water Code Sections 13267 and 13304, the Discharger shall clean up and abate the discharge and threatened discharge of petroleum hydrocarbons and other wastes discharged to the waters of the State from the Pat & Ollies – Gateway Gasoline Station and shall comply with the provisions of Order No. R6T-2002-0004 as amended by this order:

1. Section 3.1 of Order No. R6T-2002-0004 is amended to read as follows:

Order 3.1 Free Product Removal.

The Discharger shall continue to take all necessary steps to remove free product from the subsurface. Measurable (1/8 inch or more) free product shall be removed. Maintain a log of free product thickness, depth to groundwater, amount of free product removed, disposal of free product, and cumulative volume removed for each well at the site.

2. Section 6.1 of Order No. R6T-2002-0004 is amended to read as follows:

Order 6.1 Groundwater Sampling.

Collect monthly water samples from all groundwater monitoring and extraction wells (not containing free product) through September 2002. Beginning October 2002, collect water samples from all groundwater monitoring and extraction wells (not containing free product) on a quarterly basis, once every three months, during February, May, August, and November of each year. Include all wells as they are added in the future. Analyze all samples pursuant to the procedures detailed in Order 8. Submit, via facsimile, laboratory data sheets with sample results within two weeks of sampling.

3. Section 6.2 of Order No. R6T-2002-0004 is amended to read as follows:

Order 6.2 Monitoring and Remediation Status Reports.

Submit by the fifteenth of each month through September 15, 2002, reports summarizing the free product removal from the month prior. Include a copy of the logged information.

Submit complete quarterly reports (the first quarterly report due on February 1, 2003 covering the period October 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002) on the free product removal, groundwater monitoring system, and status of the groundwater remediation system, according to the following schedule:

- 1st Quarter Report (January 1 through March 31) due May 1**
- 2nd Quarter Report (April 1 through June 30) due August 1**
- 3rd Quarter Report (July 1 through September 30) due November 1**
- 4th Quarter Report (October 1 through December 31) due February 1**

At a minimum, the quarterly reports shall contain the following information:

Subsections 6.2.1 through 6.2.9 are specified in Order No. R6T-2002-0004.

All findings and requirements of Order No. R6T-2002-0004 which are not amended by this order, remain unchanged and in effect. Failure to comply with the terms or conditions of Cleanup and Abatement Order No. R6T-2002-0004 as amended will result in additional enforcement action, which may include the imposition of administrative civil liability pursuant to
