 Amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the North Coast Region to incorporate
 the Action Plan for the Gualala River Sediment TMDL

February 18, 2026

North Coast Water Quality Control Board staff propose late revisions to the Gualala Sediment TMDL Action Plan (Action Plan) that are not currently reflected in the document released to the public on February 4, 2026 in conjunction with the February 2026 Board Agenda. These revisions are in response to comments received in January 2026, after the established public comment period which closed on August 25, 2025. The recommended changes are meant to clarify the timeframe required under the Action Plan for the North Coast Water Board to develop and issue order(s) to address discharge of sediment from private rural roads.

Staff recommend that the following changes be made to the Action Plan for the Gualala River Sediment TMDL concurrent with its adoption under Resolution Order No. R1-2026-0011.

Where applicable to the North Coast Water Board, modify the *Road Maintenance and Construction on Private Lands* category within Table 6.3.4-3 of the Action Plan as follows:

<p>Road Maintenance and Construction on Private Lands</p> <p>(Private rural roads outside of those enrolled under existing WDRs or Waivers of WDRs)</p> <p>North Coast Water Board</p>	<p><u>Action:</u> Develop and issue issue order(s) to address discharge of sediment from private rural roads.</p> <p>The order(s) should require landowners with sediment-generating roads to inventory, assess, prioritize, and treat road-related sediment sources on their property over time. The order(s) can include varying requirements based on the scale and risk of sediment delivery to watercourses.</p> <p><u>Timeline:</u> Ongoing following order(s) issuance or adoption. <u>Immediate. Order(s) development and issuance will include the necessary public process including public outreach, comment, and completion of required environmental documentation prior to Board consideration.</u></p>
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
