Updated Notice of Public Hearing

Proposed General Waste Discharge Requirements for Dairies In the North Coast Region

Order No. R1-2019-0001

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that California North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) will conduct a public hearing on General Waste Discharge Requirements for Dairies in the North Coast Region, Order No. R1-2019-0001 (Proposed Order). The public hearing to consider adoption of the Proposed Order is scheduled for **April 18, 2019 beginning at 8:30 A.M.** in the Regional Water Board Hearing Room, 5550 Skylane Boulevard, Suite A, in Santa Rosa, California, or as announced in the Regional Water Board's agenda.

I. Overview

The Proposed Order includes General Waste Discharge Requirements on dairy operations and related land management activities in the North Coast Region. If adopted, five previously adopted dairy orders will be replaced by the Proposed Order. Discharges from existing dairies, new dairies, expanding dairies, and goat, sheep, and water buffalo dairies, will be covered by the Proposed Order.

The draft Order was presented at a public workshop and public hearing at the Regional Water Board office on November 14, 2018. The draft Order was distributed for public and agency review. Written comments were accepted from November 1, 2018 to January 3, 2019.

The public hearing to consider adoption of the Order is scheduled at **8:30 A.M. on April 18, 2019**, at the Regional Water Board Hearing Room, 5550 Skylane Boulevard, Suite A, Santa Rosa, California 95403, or as announced in the Regional Water Board's agenda. Time limits may be imposed on oral testimony at the public hearing; groups are encouraged to designate a spokesperson. Changes to the Proposed Order consistent with the general purpose of the Order may be considered by the Regional Water Board during the hearing.
