Project Complexity Surcharge: A complexity surcharge of an additional 20% per application (120% of the tier amount shown above) shall be included for: 1. Applications proposing to divert from a location(s) within the watershed of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Bay Delta; 2. Applications proposing to divert by means of an onstream dam(s) located within the geographic area covered by the Policy for Maintaining Instream Flows in Northern California Coastal Streams.

Item 1 – Registration Amendment Filing Fee

Current Regulation: CCR, Section 1064(a)(4), states "The fee for a petition filed pursuant to Water Code section 1228.7 to change the point of diversion or place of use under a registration of an appropriation for small domestic or livestock stockpond use shall be \$500."

Proposed Regulation Change: The fee for a petition filed <u>filing an amendment</u> pursuant to Water Code section 1228.7 to change the point of diversion or place of use under a registration of an appropriation for small domestic or livestock stockpond use shall be \$500 the same as the fee required by section 1068(a) for an initial filing of a registration.

Item 2 – Small Irrigation Appropriation Registration Fee

Current Regulation: CCR, Section 1068(e) states, "A person who registers an appropriation of water for small irrigation use pursuant to Water Code section 1228.3, for which cannabis cultivation is an intended use and for which no onstream reservoir will be constructed or used, shall pay to the board a non-refundable annual fee of \$750."

Proposed Regulation Change: A person who registers an appropriation of water for small irrigation use pursuant to Water Code section 1228.3, for which cannabis cultivation is an intended use and for which no onstream reservoir will be constructed or used, shall pay to the board a non-refundable annual fee of \$750. If a registrant no longer uses the registration for cannabis cultivation but wants to keep the diversion for another purpose of use, the registrant shall continue paying this annual fee until a request for a replacement water right has been filed and a revocation has been requested by the registrant.

Proposed Change to Water Rights Water Quality Certification Fees:

Proposal to simplify water right-related water quality certification fees – remove or modify subdivision (b)(2) from California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 3833. This would simplify the application fee structure such that applicants could more easily predict applicable fees using either section 3833.1 or section 2200, depending on the type of certification sought. This change would not be expected to significantly change fees for any other type of certification application, but may reduce overall Division costs of processing certifications slightly.
