MINUTES OF MEETING APRIL 14, 2010

At 9:00 a.m. Chairman King called to order the meeting of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) at the Regional Water Quality Control Board, 9174 Sky Park Court, San Diego, California.

<u>Item 1</u> – Roll Call and Introductions: <u>Board Members Present:</u> David King, Eric Anderson, Wayne Rayfield, and Grant Destache.

Chairman King announced that due to lack of a quorum, Items 3, 5-10, 13, and 14 were postponed until the May 12 Board meeting.

Fran Spivy Weber, State Water Board Liaison, reported on the budget situation, the Once-through Cooling Water Policy, and a federal plan to fund a grant for projects that would benefit water quality and water supply in the regions.

<u>Item 2</u> – Public Forum

Mr. Jim Bell, Director of Ecological Life Systems Institute, Inc., presented an idea to install photo voltaic panels over 4.3 percent of the roofs and parking lots in the

San Diego/Tijuana Region, which would produce enough electricity to power large scale reverse osmosis pumps to convert seawater into freshwater.

Mr. Rayfield made comments and thanked Mr. Bell for his presentation. He also asked staff to schedule a presentation on the Dana Point Desalination project at a future Board meeting.

Mr. Gibson said he would look in to it and provide an EO report, then consider scheduling an informational item on similar issues.

<u>Item 3</u> – Minutes of Board Meeting: February 10, 2010

<u>Item 4</u> – Chairman's, Board Members', State Water Board liaison's and Executive Officer's Reports: These items are for Board discussion only. No public testimony will be allowed, and the Board will take no formal action.

Mr. Anderson reported that he noticed the San Luis Rey reservoir was almost full!

Mr. Destache reported on the meetings and future actions of the Tijuana River Valley Recovery Team. Mr. Gibson reported on the upcoming workshops. Chairman King thanked them for their efforts.

Chairman King reported that he spoke at the Annual WateReuse Conference and gave details about the conference.

Mr. Gibson reported that he met with the City of San Diego to discuss their indirect potable reuse project for the San Vicente Reservoir and said they asked for a stakeholder interview. He recommended that he do the interview on behalf of the Board. The Board members supported his recommendation.

Mr. Gibson also reported that SANDAG's Quality of Life Initiative had several committees and they had asked the San Diego Water Board to participate in their Water Quality committee. Mr. Gibson recommended that he offer his services on that committee and, in the future, possibly asking the Board to select a Board member to sit on their steering committee. The Board members supported his recommendation.

The proposed settlement supports the assessment of \$57,350. If the San Diego Water Board rejects the tentative Order, the matter may be rescheduled to a future public hearing at which time the San Diego Water Board will receive evidence and testimony and consider assessment of liability. <u>Item 9</u> – Administrative Civil Liability against the San Diego Unified School District, Bell Jr. High Landfill. The San Diego Water Board will consider adoption of a tentative Order that would accept an offer to settle administrative civil liability proposed in Complaint No. R9-2009-0175 for failure to submit semi-annual monitoring reports required by Order No. 97-11, General Waste Discharge Requirements for Post-Closure Maintenance of Inactive Nonhazardous Waste Landfills within the San Diego Region. The proposed settlement supports the assessment of \$155,000. If the San Diego Water Board rejects the tentative Order, the matter may be rescheduled to a future public hearing at which time the San Diego Water Board will receive evidence and testimony and consider assessment of liability. (Tentative Order R9-2010-0020) (*Rebecca Stewart*)

<u>Item 10</u> – Administrative Civil Liability against the City of Carlsbad, Agua Hedionda Creek Emergency Dredge Project. The San Diego Water Board will consider adoption of a tentative Order that would accept a settlement reached in response to Notice of Violation No. R9-2008-0099 for alleged violations of Water

Quality Certification No. 06C-0007. The proposed settlement supports the assessment of \$47,647 and requires the purchase of 3.58 acres of habitat mitigation. If the San Diego Water Board rejects the tentative Order, the matter may be rescheduled to a future public hearing at which time the San Diego Water Board will receive evidence and testimony and consider assessment of liability. George Edwards provided information on the water quality response at Baby Beach to BMP efforts by the Orange County Watersheds group.

Board members thanked the speakers for their excellent presentation and congratulated them on their success. Mr. Gibson also expressed his thanks.
