Key CalWATRS Facts

CalWATRS PINs are completely different that eWRIMS/RMS PINs

- CalWATRS PINs migrate all records related to you, so you should only need one PIN even if you have multiple water rights.
- You may get multiple PINs if our old system had multiple accounts for you.

Most letters have been sent, letters for organization have not, you should receive them by the end of November.

Staff can help you connect if you need it sooner.


No old login/passwords from the previous system were carried over.

- Everyone will need to create a CalWATRS account.
- The PIN connects the account to your records.
- Individuals and organizations use PINs differently.

Senate Bill No. 389

CHAPTER 486

An act to amend Section 1051 of the Water Code, relating to water.

[Approved by Governor October 8, 2023. Filed with Secretary of State October 8, 2023.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 389, Allen. State Water Resources Control Board: investigation of water right.

Existing law establishes the State Water Resources Control Board within the California Environmental Protection Agency. Existing law provides generally for the appropriation of water. Existing law authorizes the board to investigate bodies of water, to take testimony in regard to the rights to water or the use of water, and to ascertain whether or not water is appropriated lawfully, as provided. Under existing law, the diversion or use of water other than as authorized by specified provisions of law is a trespass, subject to specified civil liability.

This bill would instead authorize the board to investigate and ascertain whether or not a water right is valid. The bill would authorize the board to issue an information order in furtherance of an investigation, as executed by the executive director of the board, as specified. The bill would authorize a diversion or use of water ascertained to be unauthorized to be enforced as a trespass, as specified.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1051 of the Water Code is amended to read:

- 1051. (a) The board for the purpose of this division may:
- (1) Investigate all streams, stream systems, portions of stream systems, lakes, or other bodies of water.
- (2) Take testimony in regard to the rights to water or the use of water thereon or therein.

Changing conditions



CalWATRS Timeline

March 2023: Project kickoff with Deloitte, start of development

June 9, 2025: eWRIMS (public & internal) data inputs frozen & moved into read-only

July 7, 2025: CalWATRS online for Division staff use, early access for public users

October 7, 2025: CalWATRS open for public registration

October 22, 2025: Annual reporting activated in CalWATRS

January 31, 2026: First annual reports due in CalWATRS

CalWATRS contract was on-time and under budget!

Approximately \$1 million in savings applied to enhancements



Creating Accounts & Connecting Records

Who needs to join CalWATRS?

Anyone that wants to submit forms (including annual reports) needs to create a CalWATRS account.

- Your login & password from the old system will not work in CalWATRS.
- CalWATRS credentials should not be shared the new system was built for everyone to have their own account.

How do I create an account?

Go to calwatrs.waterboards.ca.gov and select "create account".




- Everyone starts by creating an account, you will connect to your legacy records at the next step.
- Create the account for "yourself", even if you are part of an organization.

Account Security

No one likes two factor authentication, but it is more secure.

- You only have to set up one method.
- "Phone" has options for text message or voice call, for those with only a landline
- It's being added to all state systems.



What if I have an agent?

If your agent is enrolled in CalWATRS and submitting your reports, you do <u>not</u> need to join CalWATRS!

- Owners can have a CalWATRS account to see and manage their records, but they aren't required to if an agent (or a co-owner) is taking care of the required water right forms.
- If someone submitted reports for you in the past, but they were not formally established as your agent or a co-owner, you may need to add them to your water right.


What if I am part of an organization?

There is no log in for the organization, rather representatives of the organization link their CalWATRS accounts to it.

- Allows large organizations to have multiple staff working on organization records at the same time.
- Allows continuity for organizations like Trusts that own the water right and have various trustees managing the organization over time.


Organization examples in CalWATRS

How do I see my records?

People that are part of an organization join the organization.

 The first person to join an organization uses a PIN that makes them admin and allows them to approve others.

People that own water rights directly <u>migrate</u> records to themselves.

 There is a form to enter your PIN and migrate your legacy relationships so you can act on the records using your account.

Both processes are one-time, you won't have to do it again next year!



Annual Reporting

What has changed?

The information being requested has <u>not</u> changed, how you enter the information and how the questions are asked have.

Measurement devices are now managed outside of the annual report, you include the <u>data</u> for your measurements for that year in the annual report.

Changes to Reporting Requirements (Ch. 2 & 2.7) Approved and Effective September 26, 2025

CalWATRS & Email Addresses

- Diverters must use CalWATRS for water rights reports and requests
- An email address is required to register for a secure account

Groundwater Reporting Period

 The reporting period for groundwater recordation is now in line with the water year:

October 1 – September 30


Changes to Measurement Requirements (Ch. 2.8)

Updates to water measurement requirements have been delayed. The updated text was released for another 15-day comment period which closes **Friday**, **November 14**, **2025**.

The State Water Board is updating its measurement regulations to standardize measurement data submission, clarify key requirements, and improve readability.



California Water Accounting, Tracking, and Reporting System (CalWATRS)

CalWATRS is the state's new and improved water rights data system, replacing the legacy eWRIMS platform. CalWATRS is still being refined. Key features are working, but you may encounter some minor performance issues as we continue to improve the experience. We appreciate your patience as we fine-tune the system. We're actively working on enhancements, and your feedback is invaluable. Please email suggestions to CalWATRS-help@waterboards.ca.gov.

Annual water use reports must now be submitted through CalWATRS. Beginning on October 7, 2025, you can create a CalWATRS account, but you won't be able to begin reporting until you receive a personal identification number (PIN) from the State Water Board. PINs will be mailed in mid-October. If you manage multiple water rights, you may receive multiple PINs (in one or more letters). **Annual reporting for 2025 will not be available until the second half of October.**

Your eWRIMS username and password will not work in CalWATRS. If you run into problems, please email CalWATRS-help@waterboards.ca.gov or call 916.341.5333 for help.






Diversion Volume











Digitized Documents

 Because the previous system let anyone file an annual report, many ownership changes were overlooked, now is the time to clean up ownership records.
