Subject: Water Quality Control Plan for Enclosed Bays and Estuaries of California – Sediment Quality Provisions

Dear Ms. Sobeck:

I am pleased to approve the revised statewide water quality standards for sediment quality in the subject provisions consistent with the requirements of section 303(c) of Clean Water Act (CWA) and 40 C.F.R. Part 131. Supported by robust science and stakeholder engagement, the standards include objectives to safeguard aquatic life, human health, and resident finfish and wildlife from sediment contamination in enclosed bays and estuaries throughout the State.

Summarized below are the approved standards, which take effect immediately for CWA purposes. Incorporated as part of this letter are Enclosure A (Table of Approved Standards) and Enclosure B (EPA's detailed analysis of the standards and rationale for approval).

- A narrative objective protecting resident finfish and wildlife from contaminants in sediments.
- New procedures for implementing the narrative human health narratives applicable to organochlorine pesticides and polychorinated biphenyls in sediments.
- Revisions to the Chemical Score Index implementing the narrative objective for the protection of benthic communities from contaminants in sediments.
