I. Summary

This Notice of Applicability for enrollment under the State Water Board Nationwide Permits General Order (Order No. WQ 2025-0066-EXEC; SWRCB ID SB25036GN; hereafter referred to as the General Order) is issued at the request of Southern California Edison (Applicant). The General Order can be accessed at [the Clean Water Act Section 401 - Certification and Wetlands Program, General Orders webpage](https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/cwa401/generalorders.html#yr_2026) (https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/cwa401/generalorders.html#yr_2026). On January 21, 2026, the State Water Board received a complete Notice of Intent requesting authorization for the Applicant's TD2223158 & TD2223198 Nevada St. Deteriorated Pole Replacement Project (Project). After reviewing the Notice of Intent, the State Water Board has determined that the Project meets General Order requirements for Nationwide Permit 57: Electric Utility Line and Telecommunications Activities.

II. Project Description

As described in the Project Notice of Intent and supplemental information (hereafter referred to as the Application), which is incorporated herein by reference, Project purpose is to remove and replace two H-frame structures comprised of two 70-foot wood utility poles with new 70-foot all weather steel utility poles and the installation of 36-inch diameter steel caissons and anchors. Temporary impacts associated with Project activities include equipment staging, excavation, side casting, and general work activities. Permanent impacts associated with the Project include the installation of 36-inch steel caissons for H-frame 2045850E/2053970E poles, and the installation of Anchor 2045850E(A2).

III. Project Location

The Project is located approximately 15 feet east and 450 feet north of Highway 158 and is within the census-designated community of June Lake, in Mono County, California. The Project coordinates are 37.766575°N, 119.121765°W and 37.765836°N, 119.118268°W.

IV. Receiving Waters Information

The Project is located within the jurisdiction of the Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board, Victorville Office (Lahontan Water Board). Receiving waters and groundwater potentially impacted by this Project are listed in Table 1.

V. Direct Impacts to Waters of the State

VI. Lahontan Regional Board Water Quality Control Plan Waste Discharge Prohibitions

The Basin Plan contains waste discharge prohibitions for certain hydrologic units within its regional boundaries. The Project has the potential to discharge soil and construction waste to surface waters of the Mono hydrologic unit, and thus violate the discharge prohibitions for the Mono hydrologic unit, as specified in Basin Plan Chapter 4.1, Waste Discharge Prohibitions. The Lahontan Water Board may grant exemptions to the discharge prohibition for the Mono hydrologic unit, provided that the Lahontan Water

¹ Includes only temporary direct impacts to waters of the state and does not include upland areas of temporary disturbance which could result in a discharge to waters of the state. Temporary impacts, by definition, are restored to pre-project conditions and therefore do not include a physical loss of area or degradation of ecological condition.

Board finds that the exemption criteria specified in Chapter 4.1 of the Basin Plan are satisfied.

As stated above, discharges from the Project are prohibited under the General Order unless the Applicant requests and obtains an exemption to the applicable prohibitions from the Lahontan Water Board for the Project. General Order coverage is not valid unless accompanied by an exemption to discharge prohibitions in writing from the Lahontan Water Board.

Information Needed for Required Exemption

Lahontan Water Board Resolution No. R6T-2015-0038 delegates to the Lahontan Water Board Executive Officer the discretionary authority to grant an exemption to Basin Plan waste discharge prohibitions when the Basin Plan exemption conditions are met. The Applicant must demonstrate to the Lahontan Water Board Executive Officer that the Project meets the conditions in the Basin Plan for granting an exemption. If an exemption is proposed to be granted, a public notice will be posted on the Lahontan Water Board website and distributed through an interested-persons mailing list, allowing at least 10 days for comments to be submitted. At the conclusion of the public comment period, the Lahontan Water Board Executive Officer will make a written determination whether to grant an exemption to the above-cited waste discharge prohibition(s).

VII. Conditions

A. Mitigation for Temporary and Permanent Impacts

- i. All temporarily affected areas will be restored to pre-construction contours and conditions upon completion of construction activities in compliance with the General Order and according to the restoration plan submitted by the Applicant in the Application.
- ii. By January 30, 2027, the Applicant shall submit a mitigation plan to the State Water Board in accordance with section VI.F.6.e.i of the General Order. By June 1, 2027, the applicant shall submit proof of credit purchase offsetting the previous year's permanent impacts in accordance with section VI.F.6.e.i.3 of the General Order.
- iii. Total required Project compensatory mitigation information for permanent physical loss of area shall be greater than or equal to the Project's permanent impact totals listed in Table 2, above, in the form of mitigation bank or in-lieu fee credit purchases in quantities consistent with the mitigation ratios provided in section VI.F.6.e.i.2 of the General Order.

B. Reporting and Notification Requirements

The Applicant shall submit an Annual Report each year on January 15 until a Notice of Project Complete Letter is issued to the Applicant. Notices and reporting shall be provided to the State Water Board according to section VI.D, "Application for Coverage and Termination," of the General Order.

The Applicant shall submit Report Types 2, Commencement of Construction, and 3, Notice of Project Completion as described in Attachment B, "Report and Notification Requirements" of the General Order. The Applicant must also submit Report Types 4 through 9 if the Project encounters the conditions described in these Report Types. The Applicant must submit all reports and information required under this Certification according to the Report Submittal Instructions found in Attachment B, "Report and Notification Requirements," of the General Order.

VIII. California Environmental Quality Act

The State Water Board has determined that the Project is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15301. Additionally, the State Water Board finds that no exceptions to the exemptions apply to the activities approved by this Notice of Applicability.

IX. Fees

The Project is being implemented as part of the Applicant's Wildfire Mitigation Plan. The fee amount was determined as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 3833(b)(3) and 2200(a)(3) and falls under Category H – Wildfire Mitigation by Electrical Corporations, Electric Utilities, and Electrical Cooperatives.

X. Public Notice

The State Water Board provided public notice of the Application from January 22, 2026 to February 12, 2026. The State Water Board did not receive any comments during the comment period.

XI. Authorization

The Project may proceed only as described in the Application submitted to the State Water Board and in accordance with the conditions in State Water Board General Order No. WQ 2025-0066-EXEC and this Notice of Applicability. Coverage under the General Order is no longer valid if the Project (as described) is modified. I hereby issue this Notice of Applicability for the TD2223158 & TD2223198 Nevada St. Deteriorated Pole Replacement Project.
