Complaint for Permanent Injunction, Civil Penalties, and Other Equitable Relief

PLAINTIFFS, THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ex rel. State
Water Resources Control Board, and PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, acting
by and through the District Attorney for the County of Humboldt, based on information and
belief, allege as follows:

PLAINTIFFS

- 1. Plaintiffs, PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ex rel., the STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD, and PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, acting by and through the District Attorney for the County of Humboldt, (together, "People"), bring this action by and through Edmund G. Brown Jr., Attorney General of the State of California ("Attorney General"), and by and through the District Attorney in the County of Humboldt ("District Attorney").
- 2. This action is brought by the Attorney General at the request of the State Water Resources Control Board ("State Water Board") on behalf of the People of the State of California. The State Water Board is a public agency of the State of California that was established and authorized by the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act. The State Water Board was granted joint authority of water allocation and water quality protection to enable it to provide comprehensive protection of California's waters.
- 3. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25299.02, the Attorney General and the District Attorney may bring a civil action in the name of the People of the State of California for violations of state law dealing with the underground storage of hazardous substances, underground storage tanks ("USTs"), and UST systems, as set forth in Chapter 6.7 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code (hereinafter "Chapter 6.7").
- 4. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25299.01, the Attorney General and the District Attorney may apply to a superior court for an injunction or an order directing compliance against any person who has engaged in, is engaged in, or is about to engage in any acts or practices which violate Chapter 6.7.
- 5. Plaintiffs bring this action without prejudice to any other action or claims which it may

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have based on separate, independent and unrelated violations of Chapter 6.7 of the Health and Safety Code by the Defendants and/or facts which are not alleged in this Complaint.

DEFENDANTS

- Defendant Big Oil and Tire Co., is a California corporation which does business in the 6. State of California at the UST facilities identified in Exhibit "A" which are incorporated herein by reference (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Covered Facilities"). The Defendant owns and/or operates, or previously has owned and/or operated, underground storage tank systems at the Covered Facilities that are used to store motor vehicle fuel for retail sale.
- Defendant Richard W. Pomrehn is an individual who resides in Humboldt County, and at all relevant times, is and was President of Big Oil and Tire Company and, in this capacity, has responsibility for the operation and maintenance of Big Oil and Tire's facilities, including the underground storage tank systems, at the Covered Facilities identified in Exhibit "A."
- The true names and capacities, whether corporate, individual, associate or otherwise of 8. Defendants Does 1 through 10 are unknown to Plaintiffs, who therefore sue said Defendants by such fictitious names, and Plaintiffs will ask leave of Court to amend this complaint to show their true names and capacities when the same have been ascertained. Plaintiffs are informed and believe that each of the Defendants named herein as a Doe is responsible in some manner for the events, occurrences, and circumstances which form the basis of this lawsuit, and is thereby liable for the costs and other relief sought herein.
- Plaintiffs are informed and believe that at all times relevant to this Complaint, each 9. Defendant was the agent, servant, or employee of their Co-Defendants and in doing or failing to do the things alleged herein was acting within the scope of such agency or employment and with the permission and consent of their Co-Defendants. In doing and not doing the things herein alleged, said Defendants were acting within the course and scope of such agency and employment and with the permission and consent and at the direction of their Co-Defendants.
- The use of the terms "Defendant" or "Defendants" in this Complaint is intended to include 10. Defendant Big Oil & Tire Company, Richard W. Pomrehn, and all Defendants designated as

Does 1 through 10, unless the context of the sentence or particular cause of action indicates otherwise.

11. The Defendants, at all times relevant to the claims in this Complaint, were legally responsible for compliance with the provisions of the Health and Safety Code including Chapter 6.7 of Division 20 of its Covered Facilities.

VENUE AND JURISDICTION

12. The Defendants at all times mentioned herein have transacted business within the County of Humboldt, State of California. The violations of law hereinafter described have been committed within Humboldt County. Venue is proper in this county pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25299.03 in that certain of the violations alleged in the complaint occurred in the County of Humboldt. This court has jurisdiction pursuant to Article 6, section 10 of the California Constitution.

GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

- 13. Plaintiffs are informed and believe and thereupon allege that Defendants have engaged in the following actions at one or more of the Covered Facilities:
 - a. Failed to timely maintain or test cathodic protection systems and/or failed to provide or maintain cathodic protection system records as required by Health and Safety Code sections 25292.1(b) and 25293, and by California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 2635(a)(2)(A) and 2662(c).
 - b. Failed to timely perform a ten-year lining inspection as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 2663(h).
 - c. Failed to timely perform secondary containment testing pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25284.1(a)(4)(B)(ii) and as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 2637.
 - d. Failed to timely perform secondary containment repair following secondary containment test failure as required by Health and Safety Code sections 25290.1(c)(2), 25290.2(c)(2), and 25291(a)(2).

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- e. Failed to maintain a properly functional overfill prevention system as required by Health and Safety Code sections 25290.1(f), 25290.2(e), 25291(c) and 25292(d) and as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 2635(b) and 2665.
- 14. Defendants' noncompliance threatened and continues to threaten public health and safety, and the environment.
- The allegations in this Complaint relate solely to Defendants' compliance with laws and regulations governing the operation and maintenance of underground storage tanks ("USTs") at Defendants' facilities in Humboldt County, California on or before the filing of this Complaint. Nothing in this complaint relates to or pertains to any claims or causes of action arising out of past or future releases, spills, leaks, discharges from or as a cause of operation of USTs or UST systems by Defendants that may have occurred or may occur at Defendants' Covered Facilities listed in **Exhibit "A,"** and such claims or causes of action, if any, are reserved by the People of the State of California.

TOLLING OF STATUTES OF LIMITATIONS

16. Plaintiffs and Defendants entered into an agreement to toll any applicable statute of limitations on May 14, 2007, and thereafter on December 31, 2007 and December 31, 2008, the parties agreed to extend the tolling agreement. As a result of these agreements, the period of time from May 14, 2007 through the date of filing of the Complaint herein, inclusive, (the "Tolling Period"), will not be included in computing the time limited by any statute of limitations under the causes of action alleged against Defendants that may arise out of claims covered by the tolling agreement. Those claims include the claims that are brought in this action against Defendants.

First Cause of ACTION Failure to Maintain or Test Cathodic Protection Systems

- 17. Plaintiffs reallege paragraphs one through sixteen inclusive.
- 18. Within the last five years from the filing of the complaint and continuing through the present, subject to any relevant tolling agreements referenced above and after reasonable inquiry and due diligence in attempting to discover additional violations, Defendants failed to timely

maintain or test cathodic protection systems and/or failed to timely provide or maintain cathodic protection system records, at one or more of the Covered Facilities (**Exhibit "A"**) in violation of Health and Safety Code sections 25292.1(b) and 25293, and California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 2662(c) and 2635(a)(2)(A).

- 19. To the extent that Defendants are the operators and/or owners of the underground tank systems and USTs at the Covered Facilities, the Defendants are liable for civil penalties as set forth in Health and Safety Code sections 25299(a)(3),(a)(6), and 25299(b)(5).
- 20. Defendants must immediately and permanently be enjoined from further violations of Chapter 6.7 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION Failure to Perform Ten-year Lining Inspections

- 21. Plaintiffs reallege Paragraphs one through twenty inclusive.
- 22. Within the last five years from the filing of the complaint and continuing through the present, subject to any relevant tolling agreements referenced above and after reasonable inquiry and due diligence in attempting to discover additional violations, Defendants failed to timely perform a ten-year lining inspection at one or more of the Covered Facilities (**Exhibit "A"**), in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 2663(h).
- 23. To the extent that Defendants are the operator and/or owner of the underground tank systems and USTs at the Covered Facilities, Defendants are liable for civil penalties as set forth in Health and Safety Code sections 25299(a)(6), and 25299(b)(5).
- 24. Defendants must immediately and permanently be enjoined from further violations of Chapter 6.7 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION Failure to Perform Secondary Containment Testing

- 25. Plaintiffs reallege Paragraphs one through twenty-four inclusive.
- Within the last five years from the filing of the complaint and continuing through the present, subject to any relevant tolling agreements referenced above and after reasonable inquiry and due diligence in attempting to discover additional violations, Defendants failed to timely

1	perform secondary containment testing, at one or more of the Covered Facilities (Exhibit "A"),
