NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN

The California State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board or Board) will hold a public hearing at which it will consider designating the Kern County Subbasin as a probationary basin pursuant to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). The Board is seeking comments from the public to inform its decision. All members of the public are therefore encouraged to provide input at the hearing, leading up to the hearing at public workshops, or in writing, as described in this notice. The hearing itself will include time for public comments that the Board will consider. Participants can provide comments during the hearing in-person or via Zoom. Spanish interpretation will be available. Additionally, there will be a watch-only webcast option for viewing the hearing. The State Water Board will hold the public hearing at the time and location noted below.

PROVIDE FEEDBACK ON STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The State Water Board will not make a decision about a probationary designation for the Kern County Subbasin prior to the public hearing described above; however, State Water Board staff have developed a draft recommendation for the Board to consider, which describes the actions staff recommend the Board should take. Staff invite your input on the draft staff report **no later than September 23, 2024, at 12:00 noon**. BACKGROUND

SGMA and State Intervention

SGMA (Senate Bill [SB] 1168, Assembly Bill 1739, and SB 1319) requires local groundwater sustainability agencies (GSAs) to develop and implement groundwater sustainability plans (GSPs) so that the many uses of groundwater can continue into the future. If local GSAs do not propose an adequate plan to sustainably manage groundwater use in their basin, SGMA gives the State Water Board authority to protect groundwater resources through a process called "state intervention." State intervention

is additional to local management and is intended to be temporary, lasting only until local agencies demonstrate an adequate plan to manage their respective basins.

Inadequate Groundwater Sustainability Plans and State Intervention Trigger

The Department of Water Resources (DWR) has designated the Kern County Subbasin as a high-priority basin that is subject to critical conditions of overdraft. The GSAs for the Kern County Subbasin adopted five GSPs for the Subbasin in January 2020 and submitted the plans to DWR for review. The GSAs subsequently adopted revised GSPs in 2022, referred to as the 2022 GSPs, to address issues (deficiencies) identified by DWR.

On March 2, 2023, DWR determined the 2022 GSPs for the Kern County Subbasin to be "inadequate." The DWR inadequate determination of the Kern County Subbasin GSPs triggers state intervention with the State Water Board. (Wat. Code, § 10735.2, subd. (a)(3).)

Consideration of Groundwater Sustainability Plan Revisions

The Kern County Subbasin GSAs submitted seven new draft GSPs and a coordination agreement to Board staff on May 28, 2024, referred to here as the 2024 Draft GSPs. The Kern County Subbasin GSAs propose that these 2024 Draft GSPs eventually replace the 2022 GSPs. Board staff conducted a preliminary review of the 2024 Draft GSPs. Board staff believe that multiple 2022 GSP deficiencies identified both in DWR's inadequate determination and in the draft staff report remain in the 2024 Draft GSPs. Staff will continue review of the 2024 Draft GSPs in greater depth and will continue to provide feedback to the GSAs in the Kern County Subbasin regarding GSP improvement. Because deficiencies appear to remain in the 2024 Draft GSPs, and those deficiencies appear to be largely consistent with those in the 2022 GSPs, the draft staff report contains valuable recommendations and explanation of concerns that have continued applicability to the 2024 Draft GSPs.

Board staff will incorporate further review of the 2024 Draft GSPs into the final staff report. Staff invite interested persons to review the 2024 Draft GSPs and to provide written comments to the Board on whether and how deficiencies and potential actions identified in the draft staff report remain applicable to the 2024 Draft GSPs.

Effects of a Probationary Designation

After state intervention is triggered in a groundwater basin, the next step is for the State Water Board to consider making a probationary determination for the basin. This is done through a public process that includes the probationary public hearing discussed in this notice. If the State Water Board designates a basin as probationary, GSAs have time to address the issues (deficiencies) that caused the basin to go into probation while the State Water Board will focus on data collection and analysis to better understand what management challenges are occurring in the basin.

To acquire the necessary data, the State Water Board can require extractors (groundwater pumpers) to install meters to measure and report their groundwater extractions accurately. Alternatively, the State Water Board can specify other means for measuring and reporting groundwater extractions. (Wat. Code, § 10735.2, subd. (c)(3).) Extractors must report all groundwater extractions annually to the State Water Board and pay reporting fees to cover the cost of Board activities, except where excluded by SGMA or the Board. (Wat. Code, § 5202.) The State Water Board may also conduct investigations and gather data necessary for sustainable groundwater management. (Wat. Code, § 10736.6.)

Local agencies have at least one year from the probationary designation to resolve the deficiencies identified by the State Water Board. If they demonstrate to the State Water Board adequate efforts to manage the basin, the State Water Board may end state intervention and extractors would no longer have to report or pay fees to the Board. If, after a year, local agencies have not resolved the deficiencies, the State Water Board may develop an interim plan to manage groundwater use in the basin. An interim plan is intended to be a temporary measure to protect groundwater until effective local management is in place. Adoption of an interim plan would only occur after public notice and a public hearing.

The Kern County subbasin has not yet been designated probationary. No pumpers in the Kern County subbasin are required to report or pay fees to the state under SGMA at this time.
