### Steps for extractors who want an agent to report on their behalf in GEARS

Before you begin:

You will need the 16-digit Correspondence ID from the letter that was mailed to you by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board).

Visit the Groundwater Extraction Annual Reporting System (GEARS) website at:

#### Extractor Steps:

1. Enter your name and Correspondence ID from the letter received from the State Water Board into the GEARS home page under “Welcome to GEARS” and click “Next.” GEARS will take you through a couple of steps to determine if you need to report and will prompt you to create an account, if applicable. When you create your account, GEARS will send you a verification email.
2. Confirm your account by clicking the link sent in the verification email, then log in to GEARS to ensure access.
3. Provide your Correspondence ID to the agent that will report on your behalf.
4. The agent will send an invitation to your GEARS account, which you need to accept. You will receive an email notifying you about the invitation. The invitation will be the first thing you see when you log back into GEARS.
5. Once you click “accept” in GEARS, the agent can report for you.
6. After the agent has reported, check the report's accuracy by downloading it from the File Extraction Report module. You can resubmit the report if you find inaccuracies.
7. Extraction reporting fees due to the State Water Board will be calculated based on the report. The State Water Board will send you, not the agent, an invoice for extraction reporting fees. The invoice will be sent to the mailing address on file and will include instructions on how to pay.

## Important Reminders

- Extraction reports must be submitted by May 1, 2026 for extractions during the following time periods:
  - Tulare Lake Subbasin: July 15, 2024, through September 30, 2024, and October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025
  - Tule Subbasin: January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025
- Pumpers are responsible for ensuring that the information reported to GEARS by their agents is accurate, so they should check the report's accuracy as outlined in step 6.
- Low-income residents, public schools, and water systems serving disadvantaged communities are eligible to have their fees waived, if their extraction reports are submitted on time.
