Dear Chairwoman Marcus:

I'm very concerned about the problems and potential problems caused by the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant. I live nearby and I've seen the structure up close. It is aged. Active earthquake faults crisscross the region. There's nowhere to put the toxic waste they continue to generate, which is currently stored on site. The cooling system used by this outdated plant is killing billions – billions – of fish and other sea life every single year. This is wrong.

PG&E would like everyone to believe that we shouldn't worry, that the plant could withstand an earthquake like the one that caused the meltdowns in Fukushima. That they're working on a solution to the build-up of toxic waste on site. PG&E won't stop all their foot-dragging on building legally-required cooling towers until somebody makes them. Your group has the power to do that.

Make PG&E do the right thing for the environment. It's insane to keep damaging the only planet we even know of that makes life. Make PG&E put up those cooling towers – preferably before the end of the year.
