Sources of contamination are an issue. There are not enough test sites to determine those factors. Because not all groundwater basins are adjudicated, there is no clear jurisdiction of responsibility. There must be requirements to report ALL discharges and/or wells. Responsibility must go back to the property owner in non-adjudicated basins, not to the taxpayer. Landfills are overlooked and we can find no clear reporting requirement. We do understand that it may be under the local regional water quality control board, but may not be enforced. Is there an inventory of all landfills? We are concerned that the TMDLs may come from discharges from the power systems. How is that distinguished from contamination from other sources. Los Angeles is abound in oil fields. Many have been revived because of fracking. How are you handling fracking issues and methane mitigation issues. How are you addressing saltwater intrusion. How are you addressing subsidence. We see no clear cut policy on issues that may affect the water bodies.
