- Definition of Trash
- Narrative Objective for Trash
 - Amendments to Ocean Plan and Enclosed Bays and Estuary Plan
 - Insert into a new Inland Surface Waters Plan

- Conditional Prohibition of Discharge to state waters
- Implementation through permits
- MS4 dischargers to install and maintain a full capture system that traps all particles 5 mm and larger
 - In high density residential, commercial and industrial land use areas

- In other land use areas (e.g., low density residential, etc.) MS4 dischargers would
 - establish institutional controls (e.g., street sweeping, increased trash collection, education, etc.)
 - identify and prioritize areas (based on trash load) to control trash via institutional and/or structural controls

- Nonpoint Source dischargers under WDRs or Waivers (e.g., parks, marinas, non-MS4 urban areas) would develop and implement management practices (litter laws, enforcement, picnic area maintenance, etc.)
- All dischargers: monitoring plans to demonstrate effectiveness

Preproduction Plastic Pellets

- Conditional prohibition of discharge to state waters
 - with direct enforcement
- Continued requirement for coverage under the General Industrial Stormwater NPDES Permit
 - For those facilities subject to NPDES regulations
