OPINION

GENERAL DISCUSSION

Subsequent to the hearing held in the matter of Applications 5994 and 6864 on December 15, 1931, a stipulation was entered into between the applicant Coleman M. Gray and the protestants Hugh Magee and Jennie Magee, Executor and Executrix of the Estate of Victoria P. de Magee, deceased, Hugh Magee individually, Louisa Magee and the heirs of Victoria P. de Magee, to the effect that the protests might be considered dismissed provided Coleman M. Gray would reduce his application to 435,000 gallons of water per month as measured by meter to be furnished by applicant, the said 435,000 gallons to be equivalent to a continuous flow of 0.90 statutory miners inch (0.0225 cubic foot per second).

It was further stipulated that said water might be diverted from Castro Creek at a point at least 300 feet above the present intake of applicant which point was under date of February 23, 1932, described by applicant as situated 1792.71 feet north and 2107.95 feet east of the south quarter corner of Section 18, T 9 S, R 1 W, S.B.B. & M., being within Lot 6 (NE2 SE2) of said Section 18.

Application 6864 has been amended accordingly both as to amount and location of point of diversion and applicant has consented to the cancellation of Application 3004 upon the approval of Application 6864 for an amount of water not to exceed 0.0225 cubic foot per second.

OPPER

Applications 5994 and 6864 for permits to appropriate water having been filed with the Division of Water Resources as above stated, protests having been filed, a public hearing having been held and the Division of Water Resources now being fully informed in the premises:

IT IS HARREDY ORDERED that Application 5994 be rejected and cancelled upon the records of the Division of Water Resources, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHERED ORDERED that Application 6864 be approved for an amount of water not to exceed 0.0225 cubic foot per second and that a permit be granted to the applicant subject to such of the usual terms and conditions as may be appropriate.
