JUDGMENT AND DECREE

The above entitled cause having come on regularly for hearing, trial and determination on the 22nd day of June, 1942, before this Court sitting without a jury; all parties having been duly and regularly notified of said hearing, trial and determination; exceptions to the order of determination on file herein having been filed by Isabelle A. Goodspeed for herself and also in her capacity as executrix of the Estate of Vera E. Upphoff, deceased, and by Ryland C. Goodspeed and Marian L. Goodspeed; no appearance having been made by or on behalf of any of said exceptors; Thos. J. Straub and W. R. Dunn having appeared as attorneys for Pacific Gas and Electric Company; Spencer Burroughs, Henry Holsinger and C. T. Waldo having appeared as counsel for the Division of Water Resources of the Department of Public Works of the State of California; evidence having been introduced; parties not appearing at said hearing, trial and determination and not filing exceptions to the order of determination herein, having thereby waived findings of fact and conclusions of law; the Division of Water Resources having made motion for entry of judgment and decree in accordance with order of determination, including corrections and clarifications; said motion having been made and granted for the corrections and clarifications stated in the notice of intention filed herein by said Division on June 22, 1942, except as to clarification 5, beginning on page 4, line 28 and terminating on page 6, line 13 of said notice; and said cause having been submitted to this court for its determination and decision; a motion having been made by R. A. Rogers, as attorney, on behalf of the exceptors to set aside the order of submission and

1 said motion having been heard, argued and denied; the court having made and
2 filed herein its findings of fact and conclusions of law, now therefore in
3 accordance therewith

4 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED as follows:

5 1. The said order of determination as heretofore amended by the
6 Court is affirmed and adopted as the basis for the decree of this Court
7 determining and establishing the several rights in and to the use of the
8 waters of that portion of Butte Creek and its tributaries situate above the
9 Western Dam, near Nelson, in Butte County, California.

10 2. All of the rights hereinafter set forth are subject to all
11 definitions, limitations and provisions hereinafter set forth under the
12 heading, "GENERAL DEFINITIONS, LIMITATIONS AND PROVISIONS".

13 3. The following claimants are corporations organized and existing
14 under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California and their offices
15 and places of business are set forth after their respective names as follows,
16 to wit: California Lands, Inc., San Francisco, California; Corporation of
17 America, San Francisco, California; Dayton Mutual Water Company, Ltd., Chico,
18 California; Durham Mutual Water Company, Ltd., Durham, California; Pacific
19 Gas and Electric Company, San Francisco, California; Parrott Investment
20 Company, San Francisco, California; Western Canal Company, San Francisco,
21 California; and said claimants are hereinafter designated by their respec-
22 tive corporate names as above set forth.

23 4. The following claimants are corporations organized and exist-
24 ing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Nevada, authorized to
25 do business in the State of California, and their offices and places of
26 business are set forth after their respective names as follows, to wit:
27 Electric Mining Company, 518 Balboa Building, San Francisco, California;
28 M. & T. Incorporated, 353 Sacramento Street, San Francisco, California; and
29 said claimants are hereinafter designated by their respective corporate
30 names as above set forth.

31 5. The Diamond Match Company is a corporation organized and exist-

1 ing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Delaware, authorized to
2 do business in the State of California, and its office and place of business
3 is Chico, California, and said claimant is hereinafter referred to by said
4 corporate name.

5 6. Yuba Consolidated Gold Fields is a corporation organized and
6 existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Maine, authorized
7 to do business in the State of California, and its office and place of
8 business is 351 California Street, San Francisco, California, and said
9 claimant is hereinafter referred to by said corporate name.

10 7. The Federal Land Bank of Berkeley is a corporation organized
11 and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the United States of America,
12 authorized to do business in the State of California, and its office and
13 place of business is Berkeley, California, and said claimant is hereinafter
14 referred to by said corporate name.

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17 HISTORY OF THE PROCEEDING

18 8. This proceeding was initiated in accordance with the provisions
19 of Section 25 of the Water Commission Act pursuant to petitions of Durham
20 Mutual Water Company, Ltd., A. F. Lieurance, E. L. Adams and R. C. Gorrill.
21 Said petitions, duly filed with the Division of Water Resources on June 15,
22 1939, requested a determination of the rights of the various claimants in and
23 to the use of the waters of Butte Creek and its tributaries above the Western
24 Dam, near Nelson.

25 9. Upon investigation the Division of Water Resources found the
26 facts and conditions to be such that the public interest and necessity would
27 be served by the determination petitioned for. On June 15, 1939, by order duly
28 given and made, the Division of Water Resources granted said petitions, and
29 thereafter duly gave notice by publication as provided by law, setting forth
30 the fact of the entry of the aforesaid order and of the pendency of this pro-
31 ceeding, specifying the date upon which the Division of Water Resources would

1 begin its examination of said stream system, to wit: July 20, 1939, and
2 prescribing and requiring all claimants to rights in and to the use of the
3 waters of said Butte Creek and its tributaries above the Western Dam near
4 Nelson, to make proof of their claims in the manner provided by law.

5 10. At the time set in said notice the Division of Water Resources
6 began its investigation of the flow of Butte Creek and its tributaries above
7 the Western Dam, near Nelson, and of the conduits diverting water, and of
8 the lands irrigated or irrigable therefrom, and proceeded to gather all other
9 data and information essential to the proper determination of the rights in
10 and to the use of the waters therefrom, and thereafter the Division of Water
11 Resources reduced its observations, data, information and measurements to
12 writing and executed surveys and prepared maps from the observations of such
13 surveys in accordance with uniform rules and regulations duly and regularly
14 adopted by the Division of Water Resources, which surveys and maps showed
15 with substantial accuracy the course of the streams involved in said proceed-
16 ing, the location of each conduit diverting water therefrom, land irrigated
17 and capable of being irrigated by each conduit, and the kind of culture upon
18 said irrigated lands. Said maps were prepared by the Division of Water
19 Resources as the surveys and observations progressed, and when completed were
20 duly and regularly filed and made of record in the office of the Division of
21 Water Resources.

22 11. A conference of the various claimants included in said proceed-
23 ing and their representatives was called by the Division of Water Resources
24 on June 28, 1940, at Durham, in said County of Butte, for the purpose of pre-
25 senting the data that had been collected prior to that time by the Division
26 of Water Resources. After discussing the matter at said conference, an agree-
27 ment was entered into by the claimants on Butte Creek below the confluence of
28 Little Butte Creek. The agreement provided a plan of trial distribution of
29 the waters of said source among the signatory claimants pursuant to the pro-
30 visions of Section 10a of said Water Commission Act. Said plan of distribu-
31 tion was to be operative during the 1940 season only and it was provided

1 therein that the rights of said claimants should in no manner be prejudiced
2 by such distribution of water. Said agreement provided that said Division
3 of Water Resources should supervise said plan of distribution through the
4 agency of a water master. Operation of a plan of distribution, as modified
5 by additional information obtained from hearing the matters of the contests
6 was continued through the 1941 season pursuant to an agreement entered into
7 by said claimants on June 30, 1941.

8 12. Upon the completion of the aforesaid measurements and maps and
9 after filing of said observations, data, information and measurements, as
10 aforesaid, the Division of Water Resources, by order duly given and made,
11 gave notice by publication thereof as provided by law, setting forth the date
12 prior to which proofs to be furnished by claimants, in and to the use of the
13 waters involved in said proceeding, were required to be filed with the Div-
14 ision of Water Resources, and the Division of Water Resources gave like notice
15 and enclosed therewith forms of proofs as required by the Water Commission Act,
16 by registered mail, with postage fully prepaid thereon, to each claimant to
17 rights in and to the use of the waters involved in this proceeding, insofar as
18 such claimant could be reasonably ascertained at his last known place of address
19 Thereafter the time allowed within which proofs might be filed was extended by
20 order duly given and made by the Division of Water Resources, to and including
21 July 24, 1940, and within said period as so extended claimants herein duly
22 filed with the Division of Water Resources proofs of their respective rights in
23 and to the use of the waters involved in said proceeding.

24 13. After the filing of proofs by claimants as aforesaid, and after
25 the expiration of the time fixed by the Division of Water Resources for the
26 filing of said proofs, the Division of Water Resources duly assembled all
27 proofs which had been filed and prepared and duly certified an abstract of all
28 said proofs, and duly caused the same to be printed in accordance with the
29 provisions of the Water Commission Act, and thereafter by order duly given
30 and made, prepared a notice fixing and setting a time and place convenient
31 to the claimants when and where evidence taken by or filed with the Division

1 of Water Resources would be open to inspection for a period of not less than
2 ten days; and a copy of said notice together with a printed copy of said
3 abstract of proofs, was thereafter, and more than fifteen days prior to the
4 first day prescribed in said order as the commencement of the period of such
5 inspection, duly mailed by registered mail, with the postage fully prepaid
6 thereon, to each claimant who had appeared and filed proofs as required by
7 the Water Commission Act, and thereafter and in accordance with said notice
8 and with the Water Commission Act, all of the evidence taken by or filed with
9 the Division of Water Resources was open for inspection at the times and in
10 the places and for the period designated in said notice, and any and all
11 persons during said period were permitted to inspect such evidence and proofs
12 in conformity with the provisions of the Water Commission Act, and during all
13 of said period of inspection, a representative of the Division of Water
14 Resources was present.

15 14. Fifteen contests of claims were filed with the Division of
16 Water Resources within fifteen days after said evidence and proofs were
17 opened to public inspection in conformity with the provisions of Section 34
18 of the Water Commission Act; within ten days after the receipt of the notice
19 of each of said contests, the Division of Water Resources notified by
20 registered mail the contestants and the claimants respectively involved in
21 each of said contests of the respective time and place fixed for hearing the
22 matter of said contest, each of said times being fixed not less than fifteen
23 nor more than sixty days from the respective time the Division of Water
24 Resources mailed said notice of hearing in conformity with Section 35 of the
25 Water Commission Act; and the Division of Water Resources duly held hearings
26 of contests at the respective times and places fixed by said notices of hear-
27 ing, and caused a transcript of all testimony taken at each of the hearings
28 to be filed with the Division of Water Resources.

29 15. The Division of Water Resources duly made and entered on
30 April 14, 1942, its order finding, determining and establishing the several
31 rights in and to the use of the waters of that portion of Butte Creek and its

1 tributaries situate above the Western Dam, near Nelson, in Butte County,
2 California, which order was entered of record in the office of said Division
3 of Water Resources in Book 2, Orders of Determination, at page 1, and which
4 order was duly certified by the Division of Water Resources. Thereafter the
5 Division of Water Resources caused said order of determination so certified
6 to be printed in the State Printing Office and a copy thereof to be sent by
7 registered mail, with the postage fully prepaid, to each person who had filed
8 proof of claim, and to each person who had become interested through inter-
9 vention in said proceedings or as a contestant under the provisions of the
10 water commission act, in all respects as provided thereby and in conformity
11 therewith.

12 16. At the time of submission of proofs of appropriation, the
13 Division of Water Resources collected the fees due thereon, as prescribed in
14 Section 32 of the Water Commission Act, and after mailing its order of deter-
15 mination as aforesaid, computed the entire expense it had incurred in perform-
16 ing the duties prescribed in Sections 26 to 36, both inclusive, of said act,
17 and equitably apportioned against the parties the amount by which said entire
18 expense exceeded the total amount received from claimants on account of fees
19 paid at the time of submission of said proofs, and duly transmitted notice
20 thereof by registered mail to each of said parties, said notice including a
21 statement setting forth said expense and said apportionments thereof against
22 each of said respective parties, all as provided for in Section 32 of said
23 act.

24 17. After the entry of the order of determination as aforesaid, and on
25 May 11, 1942, a certified copy thereof, together with the original evidence and
26 transcript of testimony filed with or taken before the Division of Water Re-
27 sources, all duly certified by said Division of Water Resources, was filed with
28 the Clerk of the Superior Court of the State of California, in and for the County
29 of Butte. Upon the filing of said certified copy of said order, evidence and
30 transcript with the Clerk of said Court, and on May 11, 1942, the Division of Water
31 Resources procured an order from said Court setting June 22, 1942, at ten o'clock in

1 the morning of said day, in the courtroom of said Court in the city of Oroville
2 in said county and state, as the time and place for hearing on said order of
3 determination, and requiring and prescribing that on or before ten days prior
4 thereto all parties in interest aggrieved or dissatisfied with said order of
5 determination, should file with the Clerk of said Court notice of exceptions
6 to said order of determination. The Division of Water Resources thereupon
7 procured from the Clerk of said Court a certified copy of said order of said
8 Court setting the time and place for hearing as aforesaid, and forthwith the
9 Division of Water Resources mailed a copy of such certified copy of said
10 order by registered mail, with postage fully prepared thereon, addressed to
11 each known party in interest at his last known place of residence, in all
12 respects as required by the water commission act, and duly caused said certi-
13 fied copy of said order to be published as required by the water commission
14 act, and duly filed with the Clerk of said Court proof of such service by
15 registered mail and publication.

16 18. Within the time and in the manner as provided in Section 36b
17 of the water commission act, Isabelle A. Goodspeed and Estate of Vera E.
18 Upphoff, deceased, and Ryland C. Goodspeed and Marian L. Goodspeed, being
19 aggrieved or dissatisfied with said order of determination, filed in writing
20 with the Clerk of this Court, notice of exceptions to said order of deter-
21 mination. They excepted to the provisions of paragraph 77 on page 73 of said
22 order of determination, reasserted the rights set forth in their respective
23 proofs of claim filed in this proceeding, and alleged their rights were
24 superior in priority and in right to the rights of Western Canal Company set
25 forth in paragraph 75 on page 39 of said order of determination. The matter
26 of said exceptions came on duly and regularly for hearing on June 22, 1942,
27 at which time no appearance was made on behalf of said exceptors. After the
28 hearing, said exceptions were by this Court overruled, denied and dismissed.
29 A motion was filed after said hearing by said exceptors to set aside the
30 order of submission, which motion was heard, argued and denied by this Court
31 on October 5, 1942.

1 19. The Court has heretofore made and entered orders herein
2 as follows:

- 3 (1) On page 2 of said order of determination, after the paragraph
4 beginning Yuba Consolidated Gold Fields, insert a new paragraph
5 as follows:

6 "The Federal Land Bank of Berkeley is a corporation
7 organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of
8 the United States of America, authorized to do business in
9 the State of California, and its office and place of business
10 is Berkeley, California, and said claimant is hereinafter
11 referred to by said corporate name."

- 12 (2) In paragraph 20, on page 10 of said order of determination, in
13 5th line, change "six" to "seven".
- 14 (3) In schedule 1, on pages 41 and 42 of said order of determination,
15 in the description of Tract #1 of E. L. Adams and Lou R. Adams,
16 strike "since April 1, 1925" and "since April 1, 1930" as such
17 words may appear at the end of the description of each acreage.
- 18 (4) In schedule 1, on page 43 of said order of determination, under
19 the name of Bee P. Compton, change the Range in the last three
20 acreages of the Compton Lands in Sections 13 and 12 and in the
21 last seven acreages of the Patrick Lands in Sections 12 and 1
22 from "R 2 E" to "R 1 E".
- 23 (5) In schedule 1, on page 49 of said order of determination, in
24 the description of the lands of Ralph C. Gorrill, strike "since
25 May 1, 1925", "since May 1, 1926" and "since May 1, 1927" as
26 such words may appear at the end of the description of each
27 acreage.
- 28 (6) In schedule 1 on page 56 of said order of determination, change
29 the spelling of "Thermon & Wright" to "Thurman & Wright".
- 30 (7) In schedule 1, on page 57 of said order of determination, under
31 the name of United States Department of Agriculture, Bureau of

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Plant Industry, Division of Plant Exploration & Introduction,
Plant Introduction Garden, in the descriptions of the nine
acresages in Section 5, change the Township from "T 22 N" to
"T 21 N".

(8) In schedule 1, at top of page 62 of said order of determination,
indent "Centerville Power Plant" and further indent the des-
cription thereunder, so as to align said statements to respec-
tively correspond with the indentations of "DeSable Power Plant"
and the description thereunder at the bottom of page 61.

(9) In schedule 7, on page 72, strike the heading at the top of the
last five columns and in place thereof insert:

(10) In paragraph 24, on page 12 of said order of determination, make
the following changes:

- (a) In the 7th line, strike "5, 6 and 7, hereof" and insert
"5 and 6, hereof, and all allotments set forth in the
first column in "first priority class" in Schedule 7,
hereof,".
- (b) In the 9th line, change "third" to "second" and "fourth"
to "third".
- (c) In the 14th line, strike the word "and".
- (d) In the 15th line, change "Schedules" to "Schedule" and
insert a comma after "6".
- (e) In the 16th line, after the word "and", insert "all
allotments set forth in the second column in "first
priority class" in Schedule".

(11) In paragraph 58, on page 28 of said order of determination, in
the 3rd and 4th lines, strike "fourth priority class,".

1 (12) In paragraph 65, on pages 32 and 33 of said order of deter-
2 mination, strike the entire paragraph and insert the following:
3 "65. Subject to all rights hereinbefore defined, the various
4 claimants enumerated in Schedule 7 hereof are entitled to the
5 rights in "first priority class", "second priority class" and
6 "third priority class" as hereinbefore designated in paragraph
7 58, in and to the use of the natural flow of Butte Creek and its
8 tributaries, during the seasons hereinbefore stated in paragraph
9 24, for domestic, stockwatering and irrigation purposes upon
10 their respective lands as shown on said D.W.R. Map and as des-
11 cribed under their respective names in Schedule 1 hereof, in
12 accordance with the acreages to be supplied, priorities and
13 quantities of water allotted, and through the diversions numbered
14 and named as set forth in said Schedule 7; provided, however,
15 the water right of A. F. Lieurance and Lenore E. Lieurance shall
16 be subject to use by Yuba Consolidated Gold Fields for mining
17 purposes as hereinafter set forth in paragraph 66. All rights
18 in "first priority class" are equal in priority and correlative
19 in right, are superior in priority and in right to said rights
20 in "second priority class" and "third priority class" and to
21 the rights hereinafter defined in "surplus class", and at all
22 times when the available water supply is inadequate to supply
23 said rights in "first priority class", then during the continuance
24 of such shortage, the owners of such rights shall prorate the
25 available water supply, if any, in excess of the quantity required
26 to supply all prior rights, in accordance with their respective
27 allotments in said "first priority class" as set forth in said
28 Schedule 7; provided however, during the period from October 16
29 of each year to March 31 of the succeeding year, both dates in-
30 clusive, the Compton-Entler Ditch shall be allowed to flow at
31 maximum capacity through a 24-inch pipe at the intake thereof.

1 Both of said rights in "second priority class" are owned by
2 the same claimant, are equal in priority and correlative in
3 right, are subject and inferior to said right in "first priority
4 class", but are superior in priority and in right to said rights
5 in "third priority class" and to the rights hereinafter defined
6 in "surplus class". Said rights in "third priority class" are
7 equal in priority and correlative in right, are subject and
8 inferior to said rights in "first priority class" and "second
9 priority class", but are superior in priority and in right to
10 the rights hereinafter defined in "surplus class", and at all
11 times when the available water supply is inadequate to supply
12 said rights in "third priority class", then during the contin-
13 uance of such shortage, the owners of such rights shall prorate
14 the available water supply, if any, in excess of the quantity
15 required to supply all prior rights, in accordance with their
16 respective allotments in said "third priority class" as set forth
17 in said Schedule 7."

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20 DESCRIPTION OF AREA INVOLVED

21 20. Butte Creek has its source on the west slope of the Sierra
22 Nevada in the northeasterly portion of Butte County between the Humbug and
23 the Humboldt Passes. There are two tributaries of importance, namely, Little
24 Butte Creek which joins the main stream from the southeast about nine miles
25 east of Chico, and Hamlin Slough which is tributary from the southeast above
26 the Western Dam near Nelson. The flows of both tributary streams are largely
27 used above their confluence with Butte Creek during the irrigation season.

28 Foreign water is brought into the Butte Creek stream system
29 from the West Branch of Feather River primarily for the generation of
30 electrical energy, after which it is utilized to supplement the natural flow
31 of Butte Creek for irrigation purposes upon certain lands.

1 21. Butte Creek above the Western Dam near Nelson has a tri-
2 butary area of about 300 square miles. The altitudes within this area range
3 from about 7200 feet at the headwaters to about 100 feet on the valley floor
4 near Nelson. Approximately 72,000 acres of land within the basin are relative-
5 ly level in contour, 62,000 acres of which are upon the valley floor and the
6 remainder in mountain valleys or on mountain table land. A total area of
7 approximately 50,400 acres receives irrigation water from Butte Creek, of
8 which about 40,500 acres receives supplemental water from other sources.
9 Butte Creek is one of the sources of water supply for the DeSabra and Center-
10 ville power plants which have a combined rated capacity of 19,400 kilovolt
11 amperes. An aggregate of approximately 600 cubic feet per second of water
12 is utilized for mining and power purposes.

13 22. The climate of the area involved in said proceeding is typical
14 of that prevailing generally over the great central valley of California.
15 Low summer precipitation, abundance of sunshine, wide range of temperature
16 variations, low humidity and rapid evaporation are the characteristic
17 features of the weather. The mean seasonal precipitation as measured at
18 Chico, in said County of Butte, is approximately 24.04 inches, of which more
19 than ninety per cent occurs during the period from October 1 to April 30.
20 The precipitation during the summer months cannot be depended upon for crop
21 growth. Records of temperature at Chico show that the monthly mean minimum
22 temperature exceeds 40 degrees during the period from March to October, in-
23 clusive. The monthly mean maximum temperature exceeds 73 degrees during the
24 period from April to October, inclusive, and the monthly mean for this
25 period exceeds 60 degrees. The highest recorded temperature at Chico was
26 117 degrees and the lowest was 11 degrees, a range of 106 degrees. The
27 average length of growing season is about 233 days, extending from March 26
28 to November 14.

29 23. The soils of the irrigated lands involved in this proceeding
30 range from clay adobe to gravelly loams in their various phases with the
31 loams predominating. The crops grown in the area are well adapted to the soils.

1 24. A wide variety of irrigated crops is grown in the Butte Creek
2 area due to the long growing season and the well sustained summer water supply.
3 The largest acreage devoted to any one crop is that utilized for the production
4 of rice. Alfalfa, orchard and truck are also extensively grown. A smaller
5 area is cropped to irrigated grain, Egyptian corn, irrigated pasture and
6 meadow hay.

7 25. The successful production of said basic crops is dependent
8 upon irrigation, and since the water supply of Butte Creek and its tributaries
9 is inadequate for all agricultural needs throughout each irrigation season,
10 it is essential that the rights in and to the use of waters of Butte Creek
11 and tributaries be determined in order that there may be an orderly distri-
12 bution thereof to the lawful owners.

15 GENERAL DEFINITIONS, LIMITATIONS AND PROVISIONS

16 26. The term "act" when used herein means the "water commission
17 act", being Chapter 586, Statutes of 1913 of the State of California as
18 amended; the term "stream system" when used herein means Butte Creek and
19 its tributaries above the Western Dam near Nelson; the term "claimant" when
20 used herein means a party claiming rights in and to the use of waters of
21 Butte Creek or any of its tributaries above the Western Dam, near Nelson.

22 27. Although all quantities of water hereinafter found for the
23 several claimants for direct application to beneficial use are severally
24 expressed in terms of continuous flow, nevertheless, nothing herein contained
25 shall be construed as limiting or restricting the rights of any such claimants
26 to rotate in the use of water, or the right of any such claimant to divert
27 for limited periods of time convenient irrigation heads, and thus apply water
28 to his lands at a greater rate than indicated by the quantity of continuous
29 flow so found; provided, that such practice of rotation or use of irrigation
30 heads shall not result in the use by any such claimant of a total quantity
31 of water during any thirty-day period in excess of the equivalent of such

1 claimant's continuous flow allowance for thirty days, except as hereinafter
2 otherwise expressly provided in paragraphs 82, 84, 85 and 87; and provided
3 further, that such practice of rotation or such use of irrigation heads
4 shall not impair or infringe the rights of any other claimant.

5 28. Nothing herein contained shall, or shall be construed to,
6 prevent any of the claimants herein, who jointly use a ditch, where there is
7 a continuous flow allotment to said ditch, from employing by agreement of
8 such joint users of said ditch a system of rotation in use as among them-
9 selves; or prevent any claimant herein who has allotments to two or more
10 ditches, from using all or any portion of the summation of such allotments
11 through each or any of said ditches on all or any portion of his lands; pro-
12 vided the total quantity of water diverted by said claimant at any time shall
13 not exceed said summation of such allotments; and provided further, such
14 practice of rotation or such use of irrigation heads shall not impair or
15 infringe the rights of any other claimant.

16 29. The term "directly apply to beneficial use" means the direct
17 conveyance and application of water diverted to beneficial use without inter-
18 mediate storage, except such regulatory storage as may be practiced for the
19 purpose of equalizing the flow of water diverted for a convenient irrigation
20 head.

21 30. The term "natural flow" means such flow as will naturally occur
22 at any given point in a stream from the runoff of the watershed which it
23 drains, from springs which naturally contribute to the stream, from seepage,
24 and from waste and return flow from dams, conduits and irrigated lands, as
25 distinguished from released stored water, and from foreign water directly
26 conveyed to the stream from another watershed.

27 31. Nothing herein contained shall, or shall be construed to,
28 allocate to any claimant a right to divert from Butte Creek and its tribu-
29 taries above the Western Dam, near Nelson, at any time, a quantity of water
30 in excess of the amount reasonably necessary for his requirements and being
31 put to beneficial use by said claimant.

1 32. The "Division of Water Resources Map", hereinafter referred
2 to as D.W.R. Map, is the map prepared by the Division of Water Resources of
3 the Department of Public Works of the State of California, from its surveys
4 made in 1939, which map comprises seven sheets, is entitled "Butte Creek
5 Stream System Showing Diversions and Irrigated Lands, Butte County, California",
6 is dated 1939, and is on file in this proceeding.

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9 DEFINITION OF WATER RIGHTS

10 33. The rights in and to the waters, and in and to the use thereof,
11 from said stream system are divided into five separate groups, designated as
12 follows:

13 Foreign Water Rediversion Group, Non-Consumptive Use Group,
14 Little Butte Creek Group, Upper Butte Creek Group, and Butte Creek Group;
15 and all rights in each of the four first named groups, to wit, Foreign Water
16 Rediversion, Non-Consumptive Use, Little Butte Creek and Upper Butte Creek
17 are independent of all rights in the remaining three of said four first
18 named groups, but are superior in priority and in right to all rights in said
19 Butte Creek group as hereinafter set forth.

20 34. The various claimants in the proceeding are entitled to use of
21 the waters of said stream system upon the places of use hereinafter described
22 under their respective names in Schedule 1, and are entitled to divert said
23 waters at the respective points of diversion from said stream system as here-
24 inafter named, numbered and described in Schedule 2. The respective points
25 of measurement of the quantities of water hereinafter allotted to the several
26 claimants are at said respective points of diversion from said stream system,
27 except the respective points of measurement of the allotments to A. P. Kundert,
28 Roy L. Pearson, Orval L. Pearson, Eunice A. Cartwright and Mildred Laughlin
29 through the Hupp Canal (Diversions 24F and 25) set forth in Paragraph 5B
30 hereof, to Pacific Gas and Electric Company through the Butte Creek Canal
31 (Diversion 45) and the Centerville Canal (Diversion 47) set forth in

1 Schedule 6 hereof, and to Samuel A. Atkins and Barbara Ina Atkins, Edwin A.
2 Carlson and Gladys Carlson, D. A. Hook and W. S. Hook, and Elmo Jacks and
3 Louiss Jacks through the Colony Upper Ditch (Diversion 56) set forth in
4 Schedule 7 hereof, shall be at the respective places of use thereof as herein-
5 after described under their respective names in said Schedule 1.

6 35. The various claimants in the proceeding are entitled to
7 "interrelated", "special class" and "surplus class" water rights. All alloca-
8 tions of "interrelated" water rights in each of said groups in said stream
9 system, as hereinbefore designated in paragraph 33, occur in various priority
10 classes and are hereinafter set forth in Schedules 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7; each of
11 the Little Butte Creek, Upper Butte Creek and Butte Creek groups, contains
12 rights in "special class" in addition to the water right allocations set forth
13 in said Schedules 5 and 6, which rights in "special class" are superior in
14 priority and in right to all other rights in the group in which said rights
15 in "special class" respectively occur as hereinafter set forth; and each of
16 the Little Butte Creek and Butte Creek groups, contains rights in "surplus
17 class" in addition to the water right allocations set forth in said Schedules
18 5 and 7 and in addition to said rights in "special class", which rights in
19 "surplus class" are inferior and subject to all other rights in the stream
20 system.

21 36. All allotments set forth in Schedules 3 and 4 hereof, all
22 allotments in "special class" in the Little Butte Creek and Upper Butte Creek
23 groups hereinafter defined in paragraphs 46 to 57, inclusive, and paragraphs
24 62 to 67, inclusive, the allotments for domestic and stock-watering purposes
25 set forth in paragraph 58, all allotments in "first priority class" set forth
26 in Schedules 5 and 6, hereof, and all allotments set forth in the first column
27 in "first priority class" in Schedule 7, hereof, the allotment to Paradise
28 Irrigation District set forth in Schedule 5, and all allotments in "second
29 priority class" and "third priority class" set forth in Schedule 7 shall be
30 for continuous usage without regard to season; the allotments for irrigation
31 purposes set forth in paragraph 58, all allotments in "second priority class",

1 "third priority class" and "fourth priority class", except the allotment
2 to Paradise Irrigation District, set forth in Schedule 5, all allotments in
3 "second priority class" set forth in Schedule 6, and all allotments set forth
4 in the second column in "first priority class" in Schedule 7 shall be for
5 usage during the season from April 1 to October 15, both dates inclusive, of
6 each and every year; provided however, that nothing herein contained shall,
7 or shall be construed to prevent a free flow of water at maximum capacity
8 through a 24-inch pipe at the intake of the Compton-Entler Ditch (Diversion
9 54) at all times when the total natural flow available for diversion from
10 Butte Creek below the confluence of Little Butte Creek is in excess of 88.0
11 cubic feet per second; and all allotments in "special class" in the Butte
12 Creek group, and all allotments in "surplus class" herein set forth shall be
13 for diversion during the respective seasons hereinafter stated therefor in
14 paragraphs 60, 71 to 76, inclusive, and 80 to 97, inclusive.

15
16 Definition of Water Rights in Foreign Water Rediversion Group

17 37. The Foreign Water Rediversion Group, as hereinbefore designated
18 in paragraph 21, comprises all rights to redivert foreign water delivered in-
19 to Butte Creek at the Centerville Power Plant from the West Branch of Feather
20 River by Pacific Gas and Electric Company; and the total quantity available
21 for such rediversion shall be determined as the difference between the total
22 quantity delivered into Butte Creek and five per cent thereof, which five
23 per cent represents the deduction for transportation losses in the foreign
24 water between the point of delivery into Butte Creek and the point of re-
25 diversion therefrom.

26 38. The various claimants enumerated in Schedule 3 hereof are
27 entitled to said rights designated in paragraph 37, which occur in "first
28 priority class" and "second priority class", during the season hereinbefore
29 stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-watering and irrigation purposes
30 upon their respective lands as shown on said D.W.R. Map and as described
31 under their respective names in Schedule 1 hereof, and for diversion to

1 storage, through the Parrott Ditch (Diversion 50) in accordance with the
2 acreages to be supplied, and priorities and quantities of water allotted as
3 set forth in said Schedule 3. Said rights in "first priority class" are
4 equal in priority and correlative in right, are superior in priority and in
5 right to all other rights in said Foreign Water Rediversion Group, and at
6 all times when the available water supply is inadequate to supply all of said
7 rights in "first priority class", then during the continuance of such shortage,
8 the owners of such rights shall prorate the available water supply in accor-
9 dance with their respective allotments in said "first priority class" as set
10 forth in said Schedule 3. Said rights in "second priority class" are equal
11 in priority and correlative in right, are subject and inferior to said rights
12 in "first priority class", and at all times when the available water supply
13 is inadequate to supply all of said rights in "second priority class", then
14 during the continuance of such shortage, the owners of such rights shall
15 prorate the available water supply, if any, in excess of the quantity required
16 to supply said rights in "first priority class", in accordance with their
17 respective allotments in said "second priority class" as set forth in said
18 Schedule 3; provided however, the rights of M. & T. Incorporated and Parrott
19 Investment Company are subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth in
20 paragraphs 39 and 40.

21 39. The claimants hereinafter named in this paragraph shall be
22 entitled to divert from waters flowing in the Parrott Ditch and Edgar Slough
23 for domestic and stock-watering purposes and for the irrigation of their
24 lands hereinafter described under their respective names in Schedule 1, the
25 amounts set forth after their respective names as follows:

1 and said diversions and uses are subject to the provisions of the judgment
2 and decree entered in March, 1931 in the case of James D. Phelan, et al.,
3 vs. El Ora Dredging Company, et al., Superior Court, Butte County No. 11483.

4 40. At any time M. & T. Incorporated does not take and use the
5 full amount of its allocations herein set forth in paragraph 38 and Schedule
6 3, or does not take any water, Parrott Investment Company shall be entitled
7 to take and use, subject to prior rights, the remainder not taken by M. & T.
8 Incorporated, or the entire amount available for rediversion in the event
9 M. & T. Incorporated is not taking any; and at any time Parrott Investment
10 Company does not take and use the full amount of its allocations herein set
11 forth in paragraph 38 and Schedule 3, or does not take any water, M. & T.
12 Incorporated shall be entitled to take and use, subject to prior rights, the
13 remainder not taken by Parrott Investment Company, or the entire amount
14 available for rediversion in the event Parrott Investment Company is not
15 taking any.

16
17 Definition of Water Rights in Non-Consumptive Use Group

18 41. The Non-Consumptive Use Group, as hereinbefore designated in
19 Paragraph 33, comprises all rights in and to the waters, and in and to the
20 use thereof, in the Butte Creek stream system for mining and power purposes
21 and to provide potable domestic supplies, as hereinafter defined in paragraphs
22 42 to 44, inclusive, and in Schedule 4.

23 42. The various claimants enumerated in Schedule 4 are entitled to
24 rights in and to the use of the waters flowing in said Butte Creek and its
25 tributaries upon their respective lands as shown on said D.W.R. Map and
26 described under their respective names in Schedule 1 hereof in accordance with
27 the purposes, quantities of water allotted from the sources named, and through
28 the diversions numbered and named as set forth in said Schedule 4. The
29 quantities of water so diverted under said rights for non-consumptive uses,
30 with the exception of the amounts necessarily lost in transportation, shall
31 be returned from the respective places of use in the most direct manner to

1 Butte Creek and its tributaries. Each of said rights for non-consumptive uses
2 is subject and inferior to all rights situated upstream, but is superior in
3 priority and in right to all rights situated downstream from the point of
4 diversion in the Butte Creek stream system.

5 43. Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall at all times be entitled
6 to divert the entire flows of North Fork of Stevens Creek, South Fork of
7 Stevens Creek and Clear Creek into the Butte Creek Canal (Diversion 45) and
8 use said flows so diverted for the generation of electrical energy at the
9 De Sabla Power Plant; and Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall at all times
10 be entitled to divert the entire flow of Helltown Ravine up to the available
11 capacity of the Centerville Canal (Diversion 47) at the junction of said
12 ravine and said canal and use the flow so diverted for the generation of
13 electrical energy at the Centerville Power Plant.

14 44. The interests in the water rights set forth in Schedule 4 here-
15 of for Herbert W. Whitten, Marjorie C. Whitten, Olive M. Young, George Mead,
16 Anna Mead, T. H. Polk and Lucia V. Polk shall be as follows:

21 Definition of Water Rights in Little Butte Creek Group

22 45. The Little Butte Creek group, as hereinbefore designated in
23 paragraph 33, comprises thirteen rights in "special class" as hereinafter
24 defined in paragraphs 46 to 58, inclusive, interrelated rights as set forth
25 in paragraph 59 and Schedule 5 hereof, and one right in "surplus class" here-
26 inafter defined in paragraph 60. All interrelated rights, occur in "first
27 priority class", "second priority class", "third priority class", and "fourth
28 priority class". Said "special class" rights are independent of each other,
29 but are superior in priority and in right to all other rights in said Little
30 Butte Creek group.

31 46. LOVIE L. DOWNS is entitled to divert as a right in said

1 "special class" from the natural and developed flow of Downs Spring at a
2 point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 17, described in Schedule 2
3 hereof, through the Downs Spring Pipe Line,

4 0.03 cubic foot per second,

5 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
6 watering and irrigation purposes on her land hereinafter described under her
7 name in Schedule 1.

8 47. FRANCES B. HAMILTON, A. C. MUSSELMAN, and GEORGE P. MORSE,
9 collectively, are entitled to divert as a right in said "special class" from
10 the natural flows of Reilly Ravine, Musselman Creek and tributary springs at
11 points designated on said D. W. R. Map as Diversions 16A and 18, described in
12 Schedule 2 hereof, through the Hamilton Ditches,

13 0.50 cubic foot per second,

14 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic and stock-
15 watering purposes and for the supplemental irrigation of their lands herein-
16 after described under their names in Schedule 1.

17 48. JOE A. SAGI is entitled to divert as a right in said "special
18 class" from the natural flows of Sagi Springs at points designated on said
19 D.W.R. Map as Diversion 24, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Sagi
20 Pipe Lines,

21 0.15 cubic foot per second,

22 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
23 watering and irrigation purposes on his lands hereinafter described under his
24 name in Schedule 1.

25 49. MERRITT MUSSELMAN and FLORENCE V. MUSSELMAN, collectively, are
26 entitled to divert as a right in said "special class" from the natural and
27 developed flows of Musselman Springs at a point designated on said D.W.R. Map
28 as Diversion 18A, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Musselman
29 Springs Pipe Line,

30 0.10 cubic foot per second,

31 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-

1 watering and irrigation purposes on their lands hereinafter described under their
2 names in Schedule 1.

3 50. ELSIE HUME MANN is entitled to divert as a right in said
4 "special class" from the natural and developed flow of Mann Spring at a point
5 designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 35, described in Schedule 2 hereof,
6 through the Mann Spring Pipe Line,

7 0.02 cubic foot per second

8 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
9 watering and irrigation purposes on her land hereinafter described under her
10 name in Schedule 1.

11 51. FANNIE M. McENESPY is entitled to divert as a right in said
12 "special class" from the natural flow of Honey Run Creek at points designated
13 on said D.W.R. Map as Diversions 33 and 34, described in Schedule 2 hereof,
14 through the McEnespy North and McEnespy Main Ditches,

15 1.00 cubic foot per second,

16 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
17 watering and irrigation purposes on her lands hereinafter described under her
18 name in Schedule 1.

19 52. FANNIE M. McENESPY is entitled to divert as a right in said
20 "special class" from the natural and developed flow of McEnespy Spring at a
21 point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 34A, described in Schedule
22 2 hereof, through the McEnespy Pipe Line and McEnespy Spring Channel,

23 0.10 cubic foot per second,

24 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic stock-
25 watering and irrigation purposes on her lands hereinafter described under her
26 name in Schedule 1.

27 53. S. A. VANDEGRIFT is entitled to divert as a right in said
28 "special class" from the natural and developed flow of Vandegrift Spring at a
29 point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 24C, described in Schedule
30 2 hereof, through the Vandegrift Spring Ditch

31 0.50 cubic foot per second,

1 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic and stock-
2 watering purposes on his Vandegrift Spring and Little Butte Creek lands herein-
3 after described under his name in Schedule 1.

4 54. S. A. VANDEGRIFT is entitled to divert as a right in said
5 "special class" from the natural and developed flow of Michaels Spring at a
6 point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 24E, described in Schedule 2
7 hereof, through the Michaels Ditch,

8 0.15 cubic foot per second,

9 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
10 watering and irrigation purposes on his Cooper Place lands hereinafter des-
11 cribed under his name in Schedule 1.

12 55. ANNA SPANGLER is entitled to divert as a right in said "special
13 class" from the natural and developed flow of Spangler Springs at a point
14 designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 13A, described in Schedule 2 hereof,
15 through the Spangler Pipe Line,

16 0.05 cubic foot per second,

17 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic and stock-
18 watering purposes on her lands hereinafter described under her name in
19 Schedule 1.

20 56. ESTATE OF ERNEST DUENSING, deceased, is entitled to divert as a
21 right in said "special class" from the natural and developed flow of Duensing
22 Spring at a point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 14A, described in
23 Schedule 2 hereof, through the Duensing Spring Ditch,

24 0.15 cubic foot per second,

25 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
26 watering and irrigation purposes on the lands hereinafter described under the
27 name of said estate in Schedule 1.

28 57. VANDEGRIFT TRUST is entitled to divert as a right in said
29 "special class" from the natural flow of Meadow Brook at a point designated
30 on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 21, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through
31 the Meadowbrook Ditch,

1 1.00 cubic foot per second,
2 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
3 watering and irrigation purposes on the lands hereinafter described under the
4 name of said trust in Schedule 1.

5 58. F. E. WHITLOCK, ROY L. PEARSON, ORVAL L. PEARSON, EUNICE A.
6 CARTWRIGHT and MILDRED LAUGHLIN, and A. P. KUNDERT are entitled to divert as
7 rights in said "special class" through the Hupp Canal, from the natural flows
8 in the West and East Branches of Middle Butte Creek at points respectively
9 designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversions 24F and 25 and described in
10 Schedule 2 hereof, during the seasons hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, in
11 the amounts hereinafter set forth in this paragraph after their respective
12 names:

 9 entitled to rights in "first priority class", "second priority class", "third
 10 priority class", and "fourth priority class" in and to the use of the natural
 11 flow of Little Butte Creek and its tributaries, during the seasons hereinbefore
 12 stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-watering and irrigation purposes
 13 upon their respective lands as shown on said D.W.R. Map and as described
 14 under their respective names in Schedule 1 hereof, in accordance with the
 15 acreages to be supplied, priorities and quantities of water allotted, and
 16 through the diversions numbered and named as set forth in said Schedule 5;
 17 provided however, that the total allotments of water, allocated as set forth
 18 in said Schedule 5, shall only be diverted by said claimants to the extent
 19 necessary to obtain delivery at their respective places of use the amounts of
 20 water respectively set forth after the numbers and names of the diversion
 21 systems as follows:

2 right, are subject and inferior to the rights hereinbefore set forth in para-
3 graphs 46 to 58, inclusive, but are superior in priority and in right to all

5 able water supply is inadequate to supply all of said rights in "first prior-
6 ity class", then during the continuance of such shortage, the owners of such

29 said "third priority class" as set forth in said Schedule 5. Said "fourth
30 priority class" contains only one right, which right is superior in prior-
31 ity and in right to the right hereinafter defined in paragraph 60, but is

1 subject and inferior to all other rights in the Little Butte Creek group.

2 60. Subject to the rights hereinbefore defined in the Little Butte
3 Creek group, PARADISE IRRIGATION DISTRICT is entitled to divert, under the
4 right in said "surplus class" from the natural flow of Little Butte Creek
5 at a point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 22, described in
6 Schedule 2 hereof, for storage in the Magalia Reservoir,

7 9,500 acre-feet per annum,

8 said water to be diverted at any season of each year, whenever there is a
9 surplus of water over and above the quantity required to fully supply all
10 rights hereinbefore set forth to divert and directly apply water to beneficial
11 use in said Little Butte Creek group, and impounded in said Magalia Reservoir,
12 situated in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 24, E $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, W $\frac{1}{2}$ E $\frac{1}{2}$ and
13 E $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 25, all in T 23 N, R 3 E, M.D.B.&M.; said water to be there-
14 after withdrawn from said reservoir from April first to September thirtieth,
15 both dates inclusive, of each year for irrigation purposes and at all times
16 throughout each year as required for domestic and stock-watering purposes within
17 the boundaries of the Paradise Irrigation District as hereinafter described
18 under the name of said district in Schedule 1, all in accordance with Appli-
19 cation 476 filed under the provisions of the Water Commission Act; provided,
20 that prior to December 1, 1947, or such further time as may be hereafter
21 granted by the court herein, the Paradise Irrigation District shall have
22 completed said appropriation from Little Butte Creek and applied said water
23 to beneficial use in accordance with the terms of the Division of Water
24 Resources Permit 271, issued on Application 476, and shall have submitted
25 evidence of such completed appropriation and use to the Superior Court of the
26 State of California, in and for the County of Butte, and subject to the pro-
27 visions of such supplemental decree as the court herein may hereafter enter
28 in accordance with the provisions of Section 36f of said Water Commission Act.

29
30 Definition of Water Rights in Upper Butte Creek Group

31 61. The Upper Butte Creek group, as hereinbefore designated in

1 paragraph 33, comprises rights of "special class", "first priority class", and
2 "second priority class". Said "special class" embraces six rights hereinafter
3 defined in paragraphs 62 to 67, inclusive, which are independent of each other,
4 but are superior in priority and in right to all other rights in the Upper
5 Butte Creek group.

6 62. THE DIAMOND MATCH COMPANY is entitled to divert as a right in
7 said "special class" from the natural flows of Malloy Creek, Maple Spring,
8 Bull Creek, Mud Cut, and an unnamed spring at points designated on said D.W.R.
9 Map as Diversions 10, 10A, 10B and 10C, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through
10 the Diamond Match System,

11 2.00 cubic feet per second,

12 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
13 watering and industrial purposes on the lands hereinafter described under the
14 name of said company in Schedule 1; and said company is entitled to substitute
15 other sources of supply in the Butte Creek stream system to which said lands
16 of said company are riparian for the sources presently utilized as above named,
17 as the site of operations is moved from time to time; provided however that
18 the combined consumption of water by said company from the Butte Creek stream
19 system shall not at any time exceed 2.00 cubic feet per second; and provided
20 further that such substitution of sources of supply shall not impair or in-
21 fringe the rights of any other claimant.

22 63. RICHARD A. COLGAN, JR. is entitled to divert as a right in
23 said "special class" from the natural and developed flow of Cold Spring at a
24 point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 40, described in Schedule 2
25 hereof, through the Colgan Pipe Line,

26 0.14 cubic foot per second,

27 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic and
28 commercial purposes on his lands hereinafter described under his name in
29 Schedule 1.

30 64. F. K. MICKY and J. H. MYNDERMAN, collectively, are entitled
31 to divert as a right in said "special class" from the natural and developed

1 flow of M. & M. Spring at a point designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion
2 2, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Mickey-Minderman Pipe Line,
3 0.07 cubic foot per second,
4 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic and stock-
5 watering purposes on their lands hereinafter described under their names in
6 Schedule 1.

7 65. EDWIN B. GOFELAND is entitled to divert as a right in said
8 "special class" from the natural flow of Butte Creek and springs tributary
9 thereto within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3, T 26 N, R 4 E, M.D.B.&M. at any point
10 within said 40-acre tract,

11 0.20 cubic foot per second,
12 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic and stock-
13 watering purposes on his lands hereinafter described under his name in
14 Schedule 1.

15 66. J. H. LUCAS is entitled to divert as a right in said "special
16 class" from the natural and developed flow of Lomo Springs at a point desig-
17 nated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 67, described in Schedule 2 hereof,
18 through the Lomo Springs Pipe Line,

19 0.40 cubic foot per second,
20 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic and stock-
21 watering purposes and for the irrigation of his lands hereinafter described
22 under his name in Schedule 1.

23 67. CARL NELSON SWARTZ AND ESTHER M. SWARTZ collectively, are
24 entitled to divert as a right in said "special class" from the natural and
25 developed flow of Evers Spring at a point designated on said D.W.R. Map as
26 Diversion 25A, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Evers Spring Channel,

27 0.15 cubic foot per second,
28 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-
29 watering and irrigation purposes on their lands hereinafter described under
30 their names in Schedule 1.

31 68. Subject to the rights hereinbefore defined in paragraphs 62 to

1 67, inclusive, the various claimants enumerated in Schedule 6 hereof are
2 entitled to rights in "first priority class" and "second priority class" in
3 and to the use of the natural flow of Butte Creek and its tributaries above
4 the confluence of Little Butte Creek, during the seasons hereinbefore stated
5 in paragraph 36, for domestic, stock-watering and irrigation purposes/upon
6 their respective lands as shown on said D.W.R. Map and as described under
7 their respective names in Schedule 1 hereof, in accordance with the acreages
8 to be supplied, priorities and quantities of water allotted, and through the
9 diversions numbered and named as set forth in Schedule 6. Said rights in
10 "first priority class" are equal in priority and correlative in right, are
11 subject and inferior to the rights hereinbefore set forth in paragraphs 62
12 to 67, inclusive, but are superior in priority and in right to all other
13 rights in the Upper Butte Creek group, and at all times when the available
14 water supply is inadequate to supply all of said rights in "first priority
15 class", then during the continuance of such shortage, the owners of such
16 rights shall prorate the available water supply, if any, in excess of the
17 quantity required to supply said prior rights, in accordance with their
18 respective allotments in said "first priority class" as set forth in Schedule
19 6. Said rights in "second priority class" are equal in priority and correla-
20 tive in right, are subject and inferior to said rights hereinbefore set forth
21 in paragraphs 62 to 67, inclusive, and to said rights in "first priority
22 class", and at all times when the available water supply is inadequate to
23 supply all of said rights in "second priority class", then during the contin-
24 uance of such shortage, the owners of such rights shall prorate the available
25 water supply, if any, in excess of the quantity required to supply said prior
26 rights, in accordance with their respective allotments in said "second prior-
27 ity class" as set forth in Schedule 6; and whenever the total flow available
28 in Jones Creek for the rights set forth in said Schedule 6 for Edwin B. Cope-
29 land and F. K. Mickey and J. H. Minderman is inadequate to fully supply their
30 requirements said total available flow shall at such times be prorated on the
31 basis of one part to Edwin B. Copeland and three parts to F. K. Mickey and

1 J. H. Mindeman, collectively.

2 69. The right of PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY herein set forth
3 in paragraph 68 and Schedule 6 to divert 1.175 cubic feet per second in "first
4 priority class" from Butte Creek through its Butte Creek Canal at a point
5 designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 45, described in Schedule 2 hereof,
6 during the season hereinbefore stated in paragraph 36, is for public service
7 delivery to consumers hereinafter named in this paragraph through appropriate
8 openings or taps in the Upper Centerville Canal in the amounts of water not to
9 exceed those set forth opposite their respective names, as follows:

22 in this paragraph are contingent upon the use of the Upper Centerville Canal
23 (sometimes known as Old Cherokee Ditch) by Pacific Gas and Electric Company,
24 or its successors in interest, as a conduit for conveying water, but said
25 consumers shall be entitled to service as hereinabove provided at all times
26 when water is flowing in said canal; and the rights to service hereinbefore
27 set forth in this paragraph, with the exception of the right of Ellenore K.
28 Robbins and Samuel P. Robbins, are restricted to uses exclusively for domestic,
29 stock-watering and irrigation purposes, and said purposes of use, with the
30 exception stated, cannot be changed to mining or any other purpose of use.

10 Slough at points designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversions 64 and 65, des-
11 cribed in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Adams Hamlin Slough Ditch and the
12 Adams Hamlin Pump,

13 0.82 cubic foot per second,

14 for domestic and stock-watering purposes continuously throughout each year,
15 and

16 3.00 cubic feet per second,

17 for supplemental irrigation, during the period from May 1 to October 1, both
18 dates inclusive, of each year, on 1191.2 acres of their lands in Tract #2
19 hereinafter described under their names in Schedule 1; and

20 1.00 cubic foot per second,

21 for domestic and stock-watering purposes continuously throughout each year,
22 and

23 3.58 cubic feet per second,

24 for supplemental irrigation, during the period from May 1 to October 1, both
25 dates inclusive, of each year, on 2533.2 acres of their lands in Tract #1
26 hereinafter described under their names in said Schedule 1; the rights herein-
27 before set forth in this paragraph are equal in priority and correlative in
28 right with the rights hereinafter set forth in paragraph 72, and at all times
29 when the available water supply in said Hamlin Slough is inadequate to supply
30 all of said rights set forth in said paragraphs 71 and 72, then during the
31 continuance of such shortage, the owners of such rights shall prorate the

1 available water supply in accordance with their respective allotments as set
2 forth in said paragraphs 71 and 72; and said rights herein defined in said
3 paragraphs 71 and 72 are superior in priority and in right to all other rights
4 hereinafter set forth in and to the use of the waters flowing in said Hamlin
5 Slough.

6 72. HERBERT W. WHITTEN AND MARJORIE C. WHITTEN, collectively, are
7 entitled to divert as rights in said "special class" from the waters flowing
8 in Hamlin Slough at points designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversions 64 and
9 65, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Adams Hamlin Slough Ditch and
10 the Adams Hamlin Pump,

11 0.60 cubic foot per second,

12 for domestic and stock-watering purposes continuously throughout each year, and

13 3.00 cubic feet per second,

14 during the period from May 1 to October 1, both dates inclusive, of each year,
15 for supplemental irrigation on 665.3 acres of their lands hereinafter described
16 under their names in Schedule 1; and the rights set forth in this paragraph are
17 equal in priority and correlative in right with the rights hereinbefore defined
18 in paragraph 71, but are superior in priority and in right to all other rights
19 hereinafter set forth in and to the use of the waters flowing in said Hamlin
20 Slough.

21 73. Subject to the rights hereinbefore defined in paragraphs 71 and
22 72, RALPH G. GORRILL is entitled to divert as rights in said "special class"
23 from the waters flowing in Hamlin Slough at a point designated on said D.W.R.
24 Map as Diversion 66, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Gorrill-Hamlin
25 Ditch,

26 1.00 cubic foot per second,

27 for domestic and stock-watering purposes continuously throughout each year, and

28 14.00 cubic feet per second,

29 during the period from April 15 to June 30, both dates inclusive, of each year
30 for supplemental irrigation on his lands hereafter described under his name in
31 Schedule 1, provided however, the combined amount of water diverted by said

1 Ralph C. Gorrill from Butte Creek and Hamlin Slough under all of his rights
2 herein set forth in this decree shall at no time exceed 21.7 cubic feet per
3 second; and the rights set forth in this paragraph are superior in priority
4 and in right to all other rights hereinafter set forth in and to the use of
5 the waters flowing in said Hamlin Slough.

6 74. Subject to the rights hereinbefore defined in paragraphs 71,
7 72 and 73, E. L. ADAMS and LOU R. ADAMS, collectively, are entitled to divert
8 as a right in said "special class" from the waters flowing in Hamlin Slough
9 at points designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversions 64 and 65, described in
10 Schedule 2 hereof, through the Adams Hamlin Slough Ditch and the Adams Hamlin
11 Pump,

12 3.22 cubic feet per second,
13 during the period from April 1 to September 15, both dates inclusive, of each
14 year, for supplemental irrigation on 2533.2 acres of their lands in Tract #1
15 hereinafter described under their names in Schedule 1; and the right set forth
16 in this paragraph is equal in priority and correlative in right with the rights
17 hereinafter defined in paragraphs 75 and 76, and at all times when the avail-
18 able water supply in said Hamlin Slough is inadequate to supply all of said
19 rights set forth in said paragraphs 74, 75 and 76, then during the continuance
20 of such shortage, the owners of such rights shall prorate the available water
21 supply, if any, in excess of the quantity required to supply all prior rights,
22 in accordance with their respective allotments as set forth in said paragraphs
23 74, 75 and 76. In addition to the provisions hereinbefore set forth in para-
24 graph 27, whenever the flow in Hamlin Slough is adequate to so permit, water may
25 be diverted under the right set forth in this paragraph at a greater rate than
26 the continuous flow allotment herein specified; provided however, that at no
27 time shall water be diverted at a greater rate than 9.66 cubic feet per second
28 and provided further, that the total quantity of water diverted in any season

11 defined in paragraphs 74 and 76. In addition to the provision hereinbefore set
12 forth in paragraph 27, whenever the flow in Hamlin Slough is adequate to so
13 permit, water may be diverted under the right set forth in this paragraph at a
14 greater rate than the continuous flow allotment herein specified; provided how-

29 year, for supplemental irrigation on his lands hereinafter described under his
30 name in Schedule 1, provided however, the combined amount of water diverted
31 by said Ralph C. Gorrill from Butte Creek and Hamlin Slough under all of his

1 rights herein set forth in this decree shall at no time exceed 21.7 cubic feet
2 per second; and the rights set forth in this paragraph are equal in priority
3 and correlative in right with the rights hereinbefore defined in paragraphs
4 74 and 75.

5 77. Subject to all rights hereinbefore defined, the various claimants
6 enumerated in Schedule 7 hereof are entitled to the rights in "first priority
7 class", "second priority class" and "third priority class" as hereinbefore
8 designated in paragraph 60, in and to the use of the natural flow of Butte
9 Creek and its tributaries, during the seasons hereinbefore stated in paragraph
10 36, for domestic, stockwatering and irrigation purposes upon their respective
11 lands as shown on said D.W.R. Map and as described under their respective
12 names in Schedule 1 hereof, in accordance with the acreages to be supplied,
13 priorities and quantities of water allotted, and through the diversions
14 numbered and named as set forth in said Schedule 7; provided, however, the
15 water right of A. F. Lieurance and Lenore E. Lieurance shall be subject to use
16 by Yuba Consolidated Gold Fields for mining purposes as hereinafter set forth
17 in paragraph 78. All rights in "first priority class" are equal in priority
18 and correlative in right, are superior in priority and in right to said rights
19 in "second priority class" and "third priority class" and to the rights herein-
20 after defined in "surplus class", and at all times when the available water
21 supply is inadequate to supply said rights in "first priority class", then
22 during the continuance of such shortage, the owners of such rights shall pro-
23 rate the available water supply, if any, in excess of the quantity required to
24 supply all prior rights, in accordance with their respective allotments in said
25 "first priority class" as set forth in said Schedule 7; provided however, dur-

16 Lieurance and Lenore E. Lieurance to Yuba Consolidated Gold Fields, dated Oct-
17 ober 10, 1939, and recorded October 24, 1939, in Volume 231, page 6, Official
18 Records of Butte County, California, as provided in that certain agreement
19 dated September 20, 1939, by and between said parties.

20 79. Said "surplus class" embraces rights in and to the use of the
21 natural flow of Butte Creek; said rights in "surplus class" are subject and
22 inferior to all other rights in and to the use of the waters of Butte Creek
23 and its tributaries as hereinbefore set forth; and the relative priorities of
24 said rights in "surplus class" are as hereinafter set forth in paragraphs 80
25 to 87, inclusive.

26 80. RALPH G. GORRILL is entitled to divert as a right in said
27 "surplus class" from the natural flow of Butte Creek at a point designated on
28 said D.W.R. Map as Diversion 61, described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the
29 Gorrill Ditch,

30 14.00 cubic feet per second,
31 during the period from July 1 to September 30, both dates inclusive, of each

1 year for the supplemental irrigation of his lands hereinafter described under
 2 his name in Schedule 1, provided however, the combined amount of water diverted
 3 by said Ralph C. Gorrill from Butte Creek and Hamlin Slough under all of his
 4 rights herein set forth in this decree shall at no time exceed 21.7 cubic feet
 5 per second; and the right set forth in this paragraph is superior in priority
 6 and in right to the rights hereinafter set forth in paragraphs 81 to 87, in-
 7 clusive.

8 81. Subject to the right hereinbefore defined in paragraph 80,
 9 E. L. ADAMS and LOU R. ADAMS, and HERBERT W. WHITTEN and MARJORIE C. WHITTEN
 10 are entitled to divert as rights in said "surplus class" from the natural flow
 11 of Butte Creek at points designated on said D.W.R. Map as Diversions 56 and 60,
 12 described in Schedule 2 hereof, through the Colony Upper and Adam Ditches, in
 13 the amounts and for the acreages set forth after their respective names as
 14 follows:

1 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED as follows:

2 88. That each and all of exceptors Isabelle A. Goodspeed, the Estate
3 of Vera E. Upphoff, deceased, Ryland C. Goodspeed and Marian L. Goodspeed, who
4 filed proof numbers 77 and 105 in this proceeding, have failed to establish a
5 right to the waters of Butte Creek and its tributaries which are involved herein
6 and have no right, title or interest in or to any of said waters, provided that
7 nothing herein shall affect any right which said exceptors may have to the
8 service of water from a public utility.

9 89. That claimant George E. McLain, who filed proof number 11 in
10 this proceeding, has no right, title or interest under said proof in or to the
11 waters of Butte Creek involved herein, provided that nothing herein shall affect
12 any right which said party may have to the use of water from the diversion works
13 or conduits of the other parties hereto; and provided further that nothing in
14 this paragraph shall affect the rights of said party in and to the waters of
15 Little Butte Creek as in this decree set forth.

16 90. That claimants B. A. Merrifield and Elizabeth C. Merrifield, who
17 filed proof number 104 in this proceeding, have no right, title or interest in
18 or to the waters of Butte Creek and its tributaries which are involved herein.

19 91. That the Court retains continuing jurisdiction of the parties and
20 subject matter of this cause for the purpose of enforcing its judgments, orders,
21 and decrees and in particular to determine any dispute or disputes which may
22 arise regarding change in method or point of diversion, or in character or place
23 of use of water from the method, point, character or place adjudicated; and to
24 modify its judgment and decree herein as to quantities of water awarded upon
25 proceedings taken as provided for in section 36g of the Water Commission Act.

26 92. That each and every party to this act, his or her agents,
27 successors, grantees and assigns, be and hereby are estopped to object to or
28 interfere with the respective rights of others which are decreed herein.

29 93. That each and every party to this action, his or her agents,
30 successors, grantees and assigns, be and are hereby perpetually enjoined and
31 restrained from doing anything in violation of the terms or provisions of this

1 judgment and decree, and from diverting any water from said Butte Creek and its
2 tributaries above the Western Dam, near Nelson, at any time in excess of a
3 quantity reasonably necessary for and being put to beneficial use, and from
4 doing anything, directly or indirectly, that will obstruct or interfere with
5 any right of another adjudged and decreed herein.

6 94. That nothing herein contained shall, or shall be construed to,
7 modify or nullify any of the provisions of the judgment heretofore entered by
8 this Court in the case of Corporation of America, et al. vs. Durham Mutual
9 Water Company, Ltd., No. 17222, a certified copy of which judgment has been
10 filed with the records of this proceeding.

11 95. The Division of Water Resources having computed the entire expense
12 incurred by it in performing the duties prescribed in Sections 26 to 36, both
13 inclusive, of the Water Commission Act and having equitably apportioned against
14 the parties to this proceeding the amount by which said entire expense exceeded
15 the total amount received from claimants on account of fees paid at the time of
16 submission of proofs of appropriation, and having given notice thereof to the
17 parties to this proceeding as prescribed in said act; no objection having been
18 made to said expense or apportionment thereof; said apportionments having be-
19 come due and payable to said Division by the respective parties; and all parties
20 having heretofore paid their respective apportionments excepting those parties
21 against whom judgment in favor of said Division is rendered as follows:

22 IT IS FINALLY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the parties herein-
23 after named in this paragraph shall forthwith pay their respective apportion-
24 ments of the costs of this proceeding to said Division of Water Resources,
25 Sacramento, California, as respectively set forth after their names as follows:
