MODIFIED AND AMENDED DECREE

San Mateo County, California

The above-entitled cause having come on regularly for 15 | hearing, trial, and determination on December 5, 10, and 19, 1984, before this court sitting without a jury; all parties in interest having been duly and regularly notified of said hearing, trial and determination; the State Water Resources Control Board (herein-18 after referred to as the "Board") having filed with the clerk of 19 this court a certified copy of the Order of Determination and 20 Further Order of Determination Amending and Supplementing the 21 $22 \parallel 0$ rder of Determination together with the original evidence filed with or taken before the Board and certified by it; exceptions having been filed and considered; a decree having been entered; a motion having been granted to modify said decree; the Court now affirms said Order of Determination as it is modified by the 26 Further Order of Determination Amending and Supplementing the 27 Order of Determination, except to the extent that it is modified herein, and renders this decree determining the rights of all

1 parties involved in this proceeding as follows:

IT IS ORDERED ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the several rights $\mathbf{3}$ ||of all existing claimants in and to the use of water of Purisima 4 ||Creek Stream System, in San Mateo County, California, are deter-5 mined and established to be as hereinafter set forth:

1. The stipulation dated February 26, 1985, March 14, $7 \parallel 1985$, and March 15, 1985 by and between the S. H. Cowell 8 Foundation, the Regents of the University of California, and J. L. 9 Debendetti, Jr., et al., is accepted and its terms are adopted 10 herein except for the agreement of the University not to water stock direct from Purisima Creek. This agreement is personal to 11 12 | the University and is not binding on the University's successors or assigns. Since it is personal, it should not be made a part of 14 this decree. However, the court understands that this agreement 15 can be enforced among its parties.

Definitions

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- "Water Code" means the State of California Water Code. 2.
- "Stream System" means the Purisima Creek Stream It includes Purisima Creek, Whittemore Gulch, other tributaries from their headwaters to the outflow into the Pacific Ocean in San Mateo County, California, and water in subterranean streams which flow in known and definite channels and which contribute to the Purisima Creek Stream System.
- 4. "Claimant" means a party who has filed a proof of claim of water right in and to the use of Purisima Creek Stream System, or who, having filed or refused to file such a proof of claim properly, has had his right determined pursuant to provisions of Water Code Section 2577.

- "Directly apply to beneficial use" means the direct 2 conveyance and application of water diverted to beneficial use without intermediate storage, except such reasonable regulatory storage as may be practiced for the purpose of creating a convenient head for irrigation or other beneficial use allowed herein.
- "Natural flow" means such flow as will occur at the point in a stream from the runoff of the watershed which it drains, from springs and seepage which naturally contribute to the stream, and from waste and return flow from dams, conduits, and irrigated lands, as distinguished from water released directly from storage for rediversion and use, or water imported from another watershed which is released directly to the natural channel for conveyance to 13 the place of beneficial use.
- "Watershed" means the drainage area which contributes 7. 15 or flows directly to the water supply of a stream or lake. State Water Resources Control Board Map
 - 8. State Water Resources Control Board Map, hereinafter referred to as SWRCB map, was prepared by the Board from surveys made in 1978 and 1979 and updated in 1983 and 1984 to reflect the Board's determination as set forth herein. It is entitled "Purisima Creek Stream System, Showing Diversions and Irrigated Lands, San Mateo County, California," dated 1984 and is on file in this proceeding. The SWRCB map comprises one sheet which is incorporated and attached herein.

General Entitlement

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The several claimants in this proceeding are entitled to the use of water of Purisima Creek Stream System on their lands described under their respective names in Schedule 1, and shown on 1 the SWRCB map, from points of diversion described in Schedule 2. 2 during the periods of time specified in the paragraph entitled "Seasons of Use" in the amount allotted from the various sources under the priorities and for the uses set forth after their respective names in Schedules 3 and 4. The points of measurement of the $\|$ amount of water allotted shall be at the points of diversion from 7 the stream system unless otherwise specified. Nothing herein ∥contained shall, or shall be construed to, allocate to any claimant ∦a right to divert from Purisima Creek Stream System, at any time, a quantity of water in excess of an amount reasonably necessary for his beneficial use, nor to permit him to exercise his right in such a manner as to unreasonably impair quality of the natural flow. Priority of Rights

10. In Schedule 3 the allotments to various claimants from the Purisima Creek Stream System are set forth under numbered priorities. Within a given priority level all rights are equal in priority and correlative in right with all other rights of the same priority level appearing within the schedule. If sufficient water is unavailable to supply all of the allotments within a priority level, the available supply shall be prorated in accordance with the proportionate amount of water allocated to each allotment. No user of water is entitled to use any water until the allotments to all lower numbered priority levels have been filled. Thus, rights to water in the Second Priority are inferior and subordinate to all rights to water in the First Priority, but are superior in priority and entitled to full satisfaction ahead of the Third Priority.

The priorities are set as follows:

All active inside residential domestic water

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rights are in First Priority.

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- b. All active riparian rights for outside residential domestic use including water for domestic animals, irrigation and commercial stockwatering are in the Second Priority.
- c. All pre-1914 appropriative rights for irrigation and commercial stockwatering are in the Third Priority.
- d. The post-1914 appropriative right of Lindsay

 Mickles for storage of water for agricultural use is in the Fourth

 Priority.
- e. The post-1914 appropriative right of the San Mateo Junior College District for storage of water for irrigation use is in the Fifth Priority.
- f. Unexercised riparian rights will receive priori
 ties in order of the dates of their applications for activation.

 These priorities shall be subordinate to all pre-existing uses of

 water. Unexercised riparian rights may be activated and quantified

 in accordance with Provisions 19 through 21.
 - g. New applications for appropriation of water shall be processed in accordance with Part 2 of Division 2 of the Water Code (commencing with Section 1200).

21 Post-1914 Appropriations

11. Pursuant to Water Code Section 2819, the Board shall continue to administer incomplete appropriations initiated by application under the provisions of the Water Commission Act or the Water Code, as in other cases. When the Board issues a license confirming appropriative rights which are presently incomplete, the licensee or the Board may petition the court for a supplemental decree confirming the right in accordance with the license. The

1 ||following appropriations from Purisima Creek Stream System are presently incomplete.

- Lindsay Mickles is entitled to collect and store 4 \parallel 25 acre-feet of water at Diversion Points 7, 8, 9, and 10 from December 1 of each year to May 1 of the succeeding year as provided by, and subject to, the conditions of Permit 17312 (Application 24619).
- b. The San Mateo County Junior College District is 9 entitled to collect and store 17 acre-feet of water at Diversion 10 ||Point 31 on a tributary of Purisima Creek from October 1 of each 11 year to April 30 of the succeeding year for irrigation of 30 acres, 12 as provided by, and subject to, the conditions of Permit 17903 (Application 26059).

Seasons of Use

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Allotments by direct diversion for irrigation shall be ||for continuous use from March 1 to October 31 of each year. Allotments by direct diversion for domestic and stockwatering purposes shall be for continuous use throughout the year.

Domestic and Stockwatering Use

- Domestic use is limited to water applied exclusively 13. for household purposes, watering of domestic animals and irrigation of up to one-half acre of yard, garden and family orchard. Allotments for inside of residence domestic use and 200 gallons per day for watering of domestic animals are in the First Priority class of Schedule 3. Domestic irrigation is included in the Second Priority class.
- Stockwatering is limited to water required by commer-||cial livestock. All allotments designated for stockwatering in

1 Schedule 3 are for water taken under control for stockwatering purposes. For livestock having access to and drinking directly from Purisima Creek and its tributaries allotments are limited to actual use of the livestock as required. When water is taken under control by pumping from the creek amounts shall be limited as follows:

gallons per day Milch cows . (gpd) per head

gpd per head Ranch cattle and horses 15 Hogs and goats 2.5 gpd per head 1.5 gpd per head Sheep

To prevent waste of water diverted from Purisima Creek into watering troughs, surplus water shall be returned to the stream by means of a return conduit. Automatic shut-off devices may be installed on pumps as an alternative procedure. Water allotted for stockwatering shall not be used for any other purpose.

Irrigation Use

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Irrigation use is limited to the application of water 15. for the purpose of meeting moisture requirements of growing crops. All allotments for present irrigation are set forth in their priority level in Schedules 3 and 4. Future use of water under unexercised riparian rights shall be initiated as set forth in Paragraphs 19, 20, 21, and 22.

Combined Uses

16. Claimants diverting water under allotments for irrigation use are entitled to use water for domestic and stockwatering purposes incidental to the aforesaid major uses. However they are not entitled to divert in addition thereto their First Priority

1 allotments for domestic use unless the supply available under the inferior priority class allotment is insufficient to provide such incidental needs. In such event, the First Priority allotment is to be measured at the point of use.

5 Equivalent Flow to Provide Adequate Head

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17. All quantities of water allotted to the several claimants for direct application to beneficial use in Schedule 3, are expressed in terms of continuous flow. However, such claimants 9 may rotate the use of water and thus apply water to the place of 10 use at a greater rate than indicated by the quantity of continuous Iflow so allotted. The several claimants may also divert, for 12 limited periods of time, convenient "heads" to achieve the same purpose. Such practice of rotation or use of a convenient "head" shall not result in the use by any such claimant of a total quantity of water during any thirty-day period in excess of the equivalent of claimant's continuous allowance. It is further provided that such practice of rotation or use of convenient "heads" shall not cause an unreasonable interference in the regime and quantity of available natural flow to which others are entitled or which would adversely impact the existing fisheries.

Special Provisions

18. In Schedule 3 all actual uses of water for domestic purposes including all planned domestic purposes where all necessary discretionary governmental approvals have been granted are allotted First Priority rights in accordance with Water Code Section 106.

Unexercised Riparian Rights

19. Section 2, Article X of the California Constitution 1 prohibits unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use or unreasonable method of diversion of water. Future use of water under unexercised riparian rights is unreasonable when supply is inade- $\|$ quate to satisfy the rights set forth in this decree and any supplemental decree, and use should be allowed only when water is surplus to the decreed rights. Therefore, the rights to divert water to presently dormant riparian land will receive a priority as of the date of application to the Court or the Board.

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- a. All claimants and other persons not named in this 20. 10 decree owning land riparian to streams in the Purisima Creek Stream System upon which they do not presently exercise riparian rights to 12 the use of water; or upon which they do not exercise riparian 13 rights to the extent planned for the future and whose unexercised 14 | rights are not defined in this decree, shall have their rights 15 defined, and shall exercise said rights only in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph.
- Any person identified in subparagraph (a) above 18 may apply to the court under paragraph 21 or to the Board under 19 paragraph 22 for definition of an unexercised riparian right which is not defined in this decree or in any supplemental decree. If 21 the court finds that water is available and that such person proposes diligently, reasonably and beneficially to exercise such 22 right, the court shall define the right in terms consistent with 23 such proposed reasonable beneficial use. Any riparian right 24 defined pursuant to this paragraph shall be the subject of a 25 supplemental decree and shall possess a priority as of the date of 26 application to the court or to the Board, as the case may be. 27
 - Riparian rights defined pursuant to this paragraph

1 \parallel shall be subject (1) to all rights which are defined in this 2 decree, including any supplemental decree, as said decree exists on the date of application to the court or to the Board by a riparian claimant; and (2) to any appropriative right initiated by application in accordance with Part 2 (commencing with Section 1200) of Division 2 of the Water Code, prior to the date of application to the court or to the Board by a riparian claimant.

Reserved Jurisdiction

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The court reserves continuing jurisdiction, to review its decree and to change or modify the same as the interests of justice may require. The court, in its discretion, exercises its continuing jurisdiction upon application of any party hereto, or successor in interest thereto, or upon its own motion or the motion of the State Water Resources Control Board.

Changes in the Exercise of Rights

Any party who wishes to change or modify the exercise 22. of his rights set forth in the decree may request the Board to investigate said change or modification. If the Board investigates a change or modification, it shall notify all affected parties of its investigation and give them an opportunity to object to the proposed change. If any affected party objects to the proposed change or modification, the Board shall hold a hearing or other proceedings in lieu of hearing. After investigating, the Board shall file its report. The report shall state whether the proposed change or 25 | modification is in accordance with applicable law and shall make a recommendation regarding change or modification of the decree. The court shall, after reviewing and appraising any changes or modifications of the decree recommended by the Board, enter such changes

1 ∥or modifications as a supplement to its decree. The Board shall be reimbursed for its expenses of such investigation. Proceedings on the apportionment of the expense shall closely conform with the provisions of Article 13, Chapter 3, Part 3, Division 2 of the Water Code, commencing with Section 2850. Nothing in this paragraph shall restrict any right which any person may have under any statute or common law to change or modify the exercise of his 7 rights set forth in this decree.

Variable Duty of Water

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23. At times when the flow of water in Purisima Creek at the Purisima Creek Road upper bridge is between the total flow #allocated in Schedule 3 (0.750 cfs) and 3.52 cfs, each claimant listed in Schedule 4 shall have a right to divert water for irrigation in the quantities calculated according to the percentages of 15 flow set forth in Schedule 4. When the flow is less than 0.750 cfs 16 but more than 0.334 cfs, the diversions for irrigation in the third 17 priority shall be reduced in accordance with the graph attached to 18 Schedule 4 until the flow drops to 0.334 cfs or less. flow is at 0.334 cfs or less, the diversions in the third priority. shall cease. At times when the flow exceeds 3.52 cfs, water surplus to that allocated in this decree will be present. may be allocated to holders of presently unexercised riparian rights in accordance with the procedure set forth herein and to 24 persons who receive permits to appropriate the water under provisions of the Water Code. 25

Restriction of Change of Point of Diversion

24. Claimants, Kings Mountain Mutual Water Company and ∥Sierra Morena Springs Water Company (Etienne, et al.) are

1 restricted to use of water from the springs located at the points of diversion described in Schedule 2 as Points of Diversion 1A, 1B and 2. The above-named claimants shall not divert water from the channels of Purisima Creek or its tributary streams.

Effects of the Decree

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- 25. Each and every claimant, his or her agents, successors, grantees and assigns, are hereby perpetually enjoined and restrained from doing anything in violation of the terms or provisions of this judgment and decree, and from diverting any water from said Purisima Creek Stream System as defined herein at any 11 | time in excess of a quantity reasonably necessary for, and actually 12 applied to, reasonable beneficial use, under and by reasonable methods of diversion and use, and from doing anything, directly or indirectly, that will obstruct or interfere with any right of another adjudged and decreed herein.
 - This decree is conclusive and determines all existing 26. rights in the Purisima Creek Stream System as defined herein.
 - This judgment supersedes and modifies all inconsistent former judgments and decrees as to the rights to the flow of the Purisima Creek Stream System. However, this judgment does not supersede rotation or ditch agreements consistent herewith.
 - Permits and licenses initiated by application under provisions of the Water Commission Act or the Water Code shall continue to be administered by the Board as in other cases. If the Board revokes any permit or license or approves changes in a permit or license and court review of such action is sought, the court shall in its discretion upon motion of any party to the Board's proceeding, enter a supplemental decree confirming the Board's

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Any claimant who has failed to appear and submit proof of his claim as provided in Chapter 3, Part 3 of Division 2 of the ||Water Code, shall be barred and estopped from subsequently asserting any rights heretofore acquired upon the Purisima Creek Stream System as defined herein, and has forfeited all rights to water heretofore claimed by him on said stream system, other than as provided in this decree, unless entitled to relief under the laws of this state.

- 30. The parties to this adjudication shall by May 1, 1985, appoint a watermaster to distribute water in accordance with this 11 decree. This court retains continuing jurisdiction to approve any watermaster appointed under this provision, to appoint a watermaster if the parties do not do so by May 1, 1985, or to appoint a replacement watermaster if the parties do not do so within 30 days after an appointed watermaster ceases to perform duties under this Any party to the adjudication or the State Water Resources decree. Control Board may petition the court to approve or appoint a watermaster under this provision, or the court may take steps to do so on its own motion. All fees, costs and expenses of the watermaster shall be borne proportionately by the parties in the same ratio that their individual water rights bear to the total water rights herein allocated.
 - All persons diverting water from Purisima Creek shall install and maintain meters in their conveyance lines conveniently located so as to be accessible for reading by the watermaster. Meters in irrigation lines shall be calibrated to show instantaneous flow in gallons per minute and all meters shall show

1 cumulative amounts in gallons, cubic feet or acre-feet. Access to 2 the electric meters and to the place of use of water shall also be 3 provided to the watermaster. All meters shall be properly installed by May 1, 1985, and operative throughout each watermastering season. Diversions for stockwatering conforming to the provisions of Paragraph 14 are exempt from the meter. requirements.

Water Rights Disputes in Watermaster Service Area

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When a watermaster service area is created in accordance with this decree, the watermaster shall distribute the water in accordance with this decree. If a water rights dispute arises between users, the watermaster shall regulate those diversions as set forth in this decree and as necessary to settle the dispute. Any party who alleges that the watermaster is not regulating his water right in accordance with this decree may apply to the Board to investigate said allegations. The Board shall notify all 17 affected parties of its investigation and give them an opportunity 18 \parallel to respond to the allegations. If any affected party requests a 19 ||hearing or other proceedings in lieu of hearing, the Board shall duly notice and schedule a hearing or other proceedings in lieu of hearing. Following its investigation the Board shall file a report with the court. The report shall explain whether the watermaster 22 has regulated the water right in accordance with this decree and 23 shall set forth the Board's recommendation to the court for any 24 change, modification, or clarification of this decree. Any change, 25 modification or clarification of this decree recommended by the Board shall be entered, subject to Court review and approval, as a 27 supplemental decree. The Board shall be reimbursed for its

expenses in connection with this paragraph.

Statements of Diversion and Use

33. All persons diverting water under water rights other than appropriative water rights initiated after December 19, 1914, are required to file statements of Diversion and Use in accordance with Part 5.1 of Division 2 of the Water Code commencing with Section 5100; provided, however, that if a watermaster is appointed to administer this decree, the watermaster shall file such statements with the State Water Resources Control Board annually, and shall include the identity of persons who have diverted water, the general place of use, and the quantity of water diverted at each diversion point.

Riparian Owners

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34. The following claimants, and others not presently identified, own lands which have unexercised riparian rights. Since their rights on these lands are unexercised they are not allotted water in this decree for use on these lands. If the court authorizes their use of water from the creek in a supplemental decree pursuant to Paragraph 19 they will receive a priority subordinate to all pre-existing uses.

Procedures for activation of use of water by the above parties, and by others who are presently unidentified, or for expansion of use by other riparians, under unexercised riparian $\|$ rights are set forth in Paragraphs 20, 21 and 22.

35. If and when Michael and Charlene Avila obtain from the 18 State Water Resources Control Board a permit to appropriate water 19 by direct diversion from Purisima Creek for inside domestic use and 20 \parallel for outside domestic use, for use on their parcel within the NW1/4 21 of the NW1/4 of Section 10, T6S, R5W, MDB&M, their appropriation 22 \parallel shall have the following priorities under this decree: (1) 500 23 \parallel gallons per day for inside domestic use shall be in the first priority; (2) 500 gallons per day for outside domestic use shall be


