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**D E C R E E**

25 This suit was commenced on July 3, 1924. The plain-  
26 tiff thereafter filed an amended complaint to which amended  
27 complaint the several defendants filed their answers and cross  
28 complaints.

29 The parties to said suit were represented by attor-

3 Thomas F. Moran and Sardin Duamerfield originally rep-  
4 resented Minnie M. Powell, as the successor in interest of  
5 James Powell, who was subsequently represented by George L.  
6 Sanford.

7 W. W. Watson represented Bertrand Salles, sued herein  
8 as Mrs. Bertrand Salles. This defendant and his counsel were

10 Arthur F. Lasher represented Joseph F. Perazzo, succes-

12 ing the pendency of the suit, acquired by the Bank of Nevada

15 George E. Thatcher and William Woodburn, with William  
16 Forman as counsel, represented Sierra Pacific Power Company,  
17 successor to Truckee River General Electric Company, Bank of  
18 Nevada Savings and Trust Company, Antelope Valley Land and  
19 Cattle Company, and originally represented Antelope Valley  
20 Mutual Water Company, which was subsequently represented by  
21 Green and Lunsford.

22 This suit was referred to B. F. Curler, appointed by  
23 the Court on March 12, 1928, as Special Master in Chancery, to  
24 take testimony in the suit and report to the Court "as to con-  
25 clusions of fact and of law and as to the form and substance  
26 of the decree to be entered." Testimony was thereafter taken  
27 by said Special Master and documentary evidence received. Be-  
28 fore the completion of the taking of testimony said B. F. Curler  
29 resigned and Robert M. Price was appointed by the Court Special  
30 Master in his stead with like instructions and powers as  
31 those given to said B. F. Curler. Upon the appointment and qualifi-  
32 cation of said Robert M. Price as Special Master, further hearings  
were had, the cause was argued by counsel for all



1 of the parties to the suit and on July 24, 1931, submitted for  
2 decision. The Special Master thereupon prepared and sub-  
3 mitted to the attorneys for the several parties to the suit,  
4 a proposed report, findings of fact and conclusions of law  
5 and decree, for the purpose of enabling corrections of des-  
6 criptions and in other minor matters to be made. There-  
7 after the cause was, at the request of the attorneys for the  
8 several parties, reopened for the presentation of further evi-  
9 dence respecting other rights than those which had been de-  
10 termined in the proposed decree and further hearings were had  
11 and evidence, oral and documentary, presented. Thereafter  
12 the cause was further argued by counsel, corrections in and  
13 additions to the proposed decree were made and the cause again  
14 submitted to the Special Master. The Special Master thereupon  
15 made his report to the Court, submitting proposed findings of  
16 fact, conclusions of law and decree. Objections having been  
17 made thereto by several parties to the suit, the Court ordered  
18 a hearing at Carson City, Nevada, on May 22, 1933, at which  
19 hearing arguments were presented at length by the attorneys  
20 representing the several parties to the suit and the cause  
21 was submitted to the Court for decision. The Court, on May  
22 27, 1933, referred the matter to the Special Master to take  
23 further testimony respecting claimed rights of certain parties.  
24 Thereupon further hearings were had and redrafted findings of  
25 fact, conclusions of law and decree were submitted to the Court.  
26 The Court thereafter rendered an opinion upon the questions of  
27 law involved in the suit and re-referred the matter to the  
28 Special Master for redrafting of the findings of fact, conclu-  
29 sions of law and decree. The Special Master, pursuant to  
30 the direction of the Court, resubmitted to the Court and to  
31 the attorneys for the several parties to the suit redrafted  
32 proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law and decree.  
Objections to the same were filed and argued before the

1 Court in San Francisco, California, and finally submitted  
2 on January 10, 1956. The Court, having considered the argu-  
3 ments of counsel and the evidence and having made its find-  
4 ings of fact and conclusions of law, orders, adjudges and de-  
5 crees as follows:

8 1. The plaintiff, United States of America, is hereby  
9 adjudged to be the owner of the several rights acquired by ap-  
10 propriation in and to the waters of Walker River for use upon  
11 Walker River Indian Reservation in the State of Nevada as set  
12 forth in the following tabulation, which shows in columns read-  
13 ing from left to right the years in which the several rights  
14 of appropriation occurred, the amounts of water expressed in  
15 cubic feet per second at the point of diversion acquired in  
16 such years respectively, and the number of acres irrigated  
17 under such appropriations.

26 11. The parties defendant to this suit, or their suc-  
27 cessors in interest, hereinafter in this paragraph 11. mentioned  
28 whose rights were adjudicated for them, or their predecessors  
29 in interest, in the decree of this Court in the suit entitled,  
30 "Pacific Livestock Company, a corporation, Plaintiff, vs. T. B.  
31 Rickey, et al, Defendants" in Equity No. 731, are hereby severally

1 adjudged to be the owners of certain rights acquired by appro-  
 2 priation in and to the waters of Walker River and/or its tribu-  
 3 taries and are hereby decreed the rights as appropriators as  
 4 set forth in the following tabulation, which gives in separate  
 5 columns reading from left to right the name of the present  
 6 owner of an existing right, the name of the stream from which  
 7 the appropriation was made, the year when the right of appro-  
 8 priation accrued, the amount of water expressed in cubic feet  
 9 per second to the use of which the owner is entitled at the  
 10 point of diversion, the number of acres irrigated by such water  
 11 and the description of the land to which the appropriated  
 12 waters have been conducted or applied to a beneficial use.  
 13 All of the land below described is situated in townships north  
 14 and ranges east of Mount Diablo Base and Meridian and the des-  
 15 igation "N. D. B. & M." is made a part of each description of  
 16 land as fully as if specifically set forth, where the number of  
 17 acres described under the several priorities is in excess of the  
 18 number of acres irrigated, it is understood that the number of  
 19 acres irrigated are included in the specific description of the  
 20 land and that the land to be irrigated from the several prior-  
 21 ities is the number of acres specifically set forth under "No. of  
 22 acres irrigated".

K. The parties above named are hereby adjudged to be  
the owners of the use of the several amounts of water from the  
several streams as above set forth and are entitled to divert and  
use such waters of Walker River and/or its tributaries as the  
case may be, for the beneficial purposes specified, subject to  
and in accord with the priorities above set forth. Wherever two  
or more persons are given a priority as of the same year and from

1 the same stream, such priorities shall be decreed to be identical

1 XII. This decree shall be deemed to determine all of  
2 the rights of the parties to this suit and their successors in  
3 interest in and to the waters of Walker River and its tributaries,  
4 except the undetermined rights of Walker River Irrigation District  
5 under its applications to the State Water Commission of the State  
6 of California and the undetermined rights of the applicants for  
7 permits from the State Engineer of the State of Nevada hereinabove  
8 specified, and it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that  
9 none of the parties to this suit has any right, title, interest  
10 or estate in or to the waters of said Walker River, its branches  
11 or its tributaries other than as above set forth, excepting the  
12 undetermined rights of Walker River Irrigation District and the  
13 several applicants for permits from the State Engineer of the  
14 State of Nevada. Nothing herein shall prejudice the rights of  
15 any of the parties defendant hereto under any transfer or legal  
16 succession in interest since the commencement of this suit to any  
17 of the rights hereby adjudicated to the several parties defen-  
18 dant.

19  
20 XIII. Nothing herein shall affect the right of any of  
21 the parties hereto to rotate the use of water, or to combine or  
22 exchange the use thereof, so far as they may do so without in-  
23 juriously affecting the rights of any of the other parties here-  
24 to, and the Water Master, hereinafter mentioned, may permit the  
25 said parties to rotate the use of said water or to combine or ex-  
26 change the use thereof, having due regard to the priorities herein

30 XIV. The Court retains jurisdiction of this cause for

1 the purpose of changing the duty of water or for correcting or  
2 modifying this decree; Also for regulatory purposes, including *of R.*  
3 a change of the place of use of any water user, but no water  
4 shall be sold or delivered outside of the basin of the Walker  
5 River except that appurtenant to the lands of Mrs. J. A. Conway  
6 and R. P. Conway referred to in the foregoing tabulation.

7 The Court shall hereafter make such regulations as to  
8 notice and form or substance of any applications for change or  
9 modification of this decree, or for change of place or manner of  
10 use of water as it may deem necessary.

11 The owner of each ditch or canal herein authorized to  
12 divert water from the Walker River or its tributaries shall at  
13 his or its own expense install and at all times maintain at or  
14 near the intake of such ditch or canal, a reliable, sufficient  
15 and easily operated regulating headgate and locking measuring  
16 box, flume or other device to be approved by the Water Master,  
17 whereby the water diverted into such ditch or canal may be regu-  
18 lated and correctly measured. Upon failure of any owner of such  
19 ditch or canal to install such regulating, locking and measuring  
20 device on or before the first day of May, 1937, or at such ear-  
21 lier date as may be fixed or demanded by the Water Master, upon  
22 ten days' notice, or to maintain such regulating, locking or  
23 measuring device, the Water Master shall cut off the water from  
24 such ditch or canal until the same shall be so installed and  
25 maintained.

26  
27 XV. The Court whenever it shall deem it necessary,  
28 shall appoint a Water Master, who shall be charged with the duty  
29 of apportioning and distributing the waters of the Walker River,  
30 its forks and tributaries in the State of Nevada and in the State  
31  
32

1 of California, including water for storage and stored water, in  
2 accordance with the provisions of this decree. The said Water  
3 Master shall serve until the further order of this Court and may  
4 be removed by the Court at any time. The Water Master shall have  
5 authority to appoint                   deputies to assist him. Upon  
6 application to the Court he may employ such additional assistants  
7 as the circumstances may require. The said Water Master shall re-  
8 ceive an annual salary of \$                   , payable in monthly in-  
9 stallments of \$                   . The compensation of his assist-  
10 ants shall be fixed by the Court from time to time. The said  
11 Water Master also shall be authorized to rent, furnish and main-  
12 tain an office for his use and to incur necessary expenses for  
13 transportation of himself and his assistants and for other proper  
14 purposes, all of which shall be reported to and be approved by the  
15 Court twice yearly, that is to say, on the first day of May and  
16 the first day of November in each year.

17           The compensation of the Water Master and his assistants  
18 and all expenses connected with his employment shall be appor-  
19 tioned among the several parties hereto, both in the State of  
20 Nevada and in the State of California, according to the acreage  
21 of the lands irrigated under this decree, including stored water  
22 and the Court reserves jurisdiction to hereafter enter judgment  
23 for any unpaid portion of said expenses and to make and enforce  
24 such regulations for the collection of said money as may be neces-  
25 sary and proper.

26           The said Water Master, with the approval of the Court,  
27 may make such rules as may be necessary and proper for the en-  
28 forcement of this decree and for the carrying out of its purposes  
29 and object and the proper apportionment and distribution, includ-  
30 ing rotation of the use of water where necessary, of the waters  
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1 of said Walker River among and to the persons entitled thereto,  
2 including water for storage and stored water.

3  
4 XVI. The irrigation season along the Walker River,  
5 its branches and its tributaries, extends from the first day of  
6 March to the thirtieth day of September of each year, except that  
7 in Bridgeport Valley on the East Walker River and at all points  
8 above Coleville Gauging Station on the West Walker River the  
9 irrigating season covers the period from March first to September  
10 fifteenth of each year.

11  
12 XVII. Each of the parties to this suit shall severally  
13 pay their costs therein expended.

14  
15 XVIII. The Special Masters, B. F. Curler and Robert M.  
16 Price, heretofore appointed by the Court "to take the evidence  
17 and testimony herein, and to report the same to the Court with  
18 his recommendations for the advice of the Court as to conclusions  
19 of fact and of law, and as to the form and substance of the de-  
20 cree to be entered" shall be paid for their several services by  
21 the United States of America, such sums respectively as the Court  
22 shall hereafter order.
