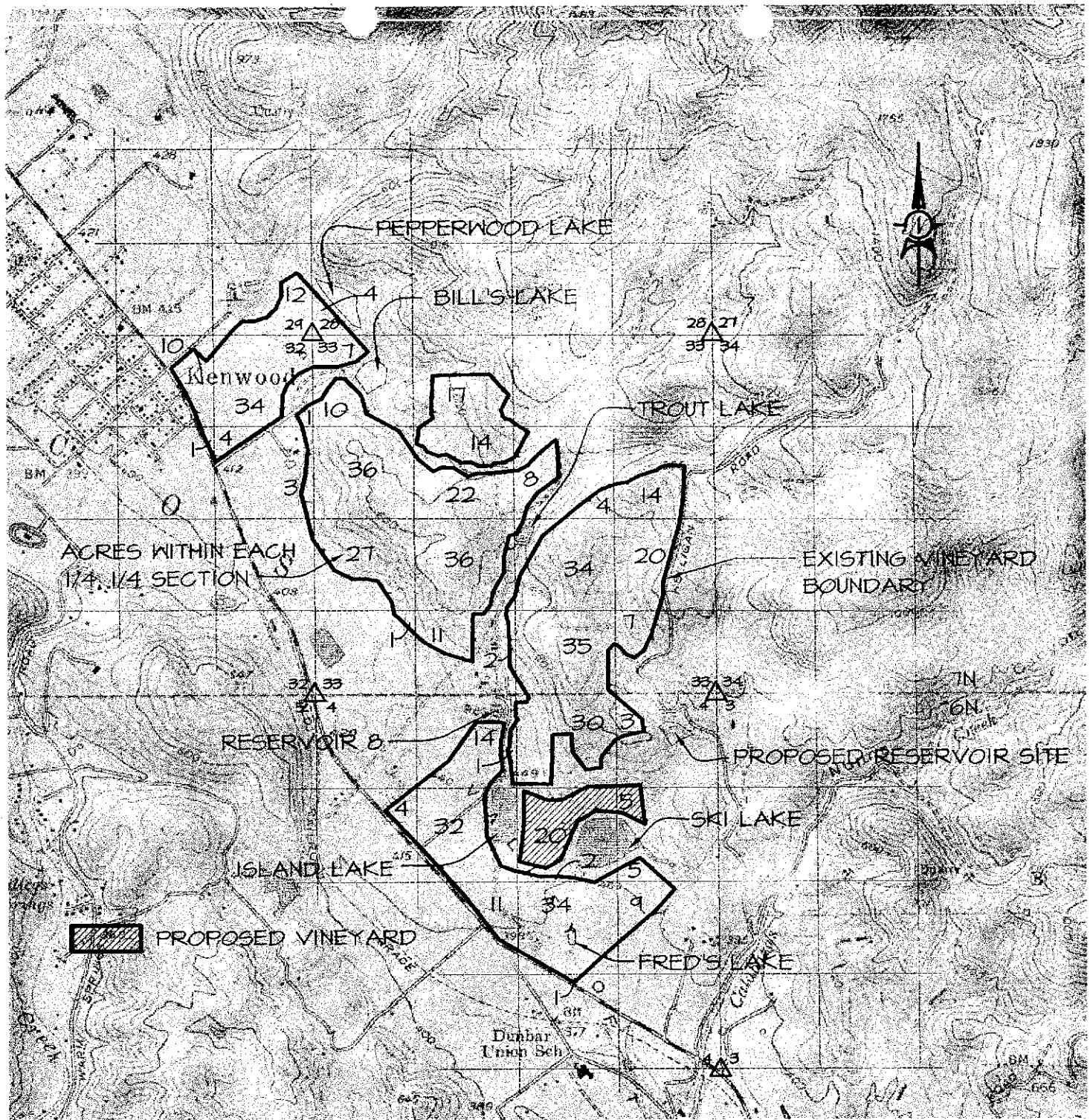

Applications 30368, 30369 and 30405 were filed in 1994 to bring existing operations into compliance. At the time of filing, there were several acres of existing vineyard that were not being irrigated with appropriated surface water, and were not included as place of use in the applications. Since that time, the irrigation and frost control systems have been extended into those areas, so petitions are being filed to add the additional vineyard as place of use under the pending applications. Additionally, 25 acres of pasture land will be converted to vineyard, and is included as place of use in the petitions.

GOVERNMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

Before a final decision can be made on your change petition, we must consider the information contained in an environmental document prepared in compliance with the requirements of CEQA.
