The offstream reservoir constructed pursuant to Permits 17266A & B has been filled in and planted over with vineyard. A new dam and reservoir has been constructed on an adjacent drainage tributary to Edwards Creek and whose confluence with Edwards Creek is upstream from the existing point of diversion. This petition seeks to add the dam as a second point of diversion, and to retain the authorized diversion to offstream storage from Edwards Creek. Because the place of storage under Permit 24790A has changed, this petition also acts as a petition to redistribute storage. The existing reservoir has a capacity of 12 AF. Permittee proposes enlarging the reservoir to allow for the authorized storage of 60 AF. In addition, these petitions seek to expand the place of use from 88 acres to 116 acres. The authorized 88 acres of vineyard have been planted, as well as an additional +/-8 acres not currently authorized by the permits. Permittee proposes to plant another +/-20 acres.

Edwards Creek may support Steelhead Trout and other non-game fish species. The
diversion from Edwards Creek is already permitted, and there are no aspects of this
petition that will result in impacts to any fish species.

Identify the typical species of riparian and terrestrial wildlife in the area and discuss whether or not any of these species and/or their habitat has been or would be affected by your proposed changes through construction of additional water diversion and distribution works and/or changes in land use in the place of water use. The wildlife in the project area is typical to vineyard and north coastal hillsides. The area
where additional vineyard is proposed, is mostly open grassland with a few scattered oaks.
Development of 20 acres of vineyard will not impact wildlife species.
