

ATTACHMENTS TO ACCOMPANY PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME ZONE 7 WATER AGENCY PERMIT 11319 (APPLICATION 17002)

Item 13: Reasons why construction and/or use of water were not completed within time previously allowed.

As stated in the Petition for Time Extension filed in 1997 and in the annual Progress Reports by Permittee the construction and use of facilities for the conveyance of water to and through the "Chain-of-Lakes" project cannot be completed until current gravel mining activity is completed and ownership of the pits is transferred to Zone 7 which is expected in 2030. Water cannot be put to full beneficial use until this portion of the project is complete.

Item 14: What water conservation measures are in effect or feasible within the place of use?

All water delivered to municipal purveyors and agricultural contractors is metered. Zone 7 works with municipal water purveyors to distribute information and generate public awareness of the benefits of water conservation. Developed rebate programs to promote the purchases and use of ultra low flow toilets, high efficiency clothes washers and commercial pre-rinse sprayers saving approximately 900 acre-feet since its inception in 1998.
