The City of Ukiah proposes a project to bring recycled water to the drought-stricken area of Mendocino County near the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). Recycled water would be used to augment the existing surface and groundwater supplies near the City and be used for the irrigation and seasonal frost protection of vineyards and orchards. Recycled water from the WWTP is not currently used for any uses and is disposed of according to the NPDES permit requirements in either on-site percolation/evaporation ponds or discharged to the Russian River when allowed by permit conditions.

The proposed project would include construction of approximately 3.7 miles of 12-16 inch diameter recycled water pipeline to serve approximately 427acres of farmlands surrounding and near to the WWTP. The new pipeline is expected to serve 8 customers, many of which are large agricultural parcels. Recycled water supplied would be tertiary treated effluent from the Ukiah WWTP. Water produced at this facility that would be supplied to potential use sites would meet requirements for disinfected tertiary recycled water "unrestricted use" defined in CA Code of Regulations, Title 22, Sections 60301 - 60355. The proposed pipeline network would be located primarily within existing roadways and private easements of the proposed users. A new pump station and new storage reservoir, both constructed on the WWTP site, are also included in the project. See Attachment 2 for a Imap of the proposed pipeline locations.

Construction activities for this project would occur with periodic activity peaks, requiring brief periods of significant effort followed by longer periods off reduced activities. Staging areas for storage of pipe, construction equipment, and other materials would be placed within the WWTP's existing facilities at locations that minimize hauling distances and long-term disruption.

Currently, only 2 parcels have their own on-site private storage that would be used for recycled water. All of the other users would rely on system pressure to feed their sites and irrigation/frost facilities.

The project is not expected to result in any changes in land use.

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGES

The Ukiah WWTP is permitted to discharge disinfected secondary effluent to three percolation/evaporation ponds located at the Ukiah WWTP on a year-round basis, and discharge disinfected tertiary effluent to the Russian River (River) as allowed during wet weather months. The Ukiah WWTP is permitted to discharge disinfected tertiary effluent to the River from October 1 through May 14 at a defined discharge rate.

The change proposed is for the Ukiah WWTP to also discharge disinfected tertiary effluent to a new recycled water storage pond at the WWTP. This pond would then pump the Title 22 recycled water to the above listed proposed places of use shown in Table 1.
