**NOTICE OF WASTEWATER CHANGE PETITION WW0085  
FOR CITY OF BRENTWOOD WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT**

COUNTY: Contra Costa      STREAM SYSTEM: Marsh Creek

The City of Brentwood (City) has filed a wastewater change petition, seeking to reduce the discharge of treated wastewater from its Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to Marsh Creek tributary to the San Joaquin River. With the petition, the City requests to reclaim an annual average of 1.74 million gallons per day (mgd) of its tertiary treated wastewater effluent for industrial use and landscape irrigation. Summary of Wastewater Discharge

Point of Discharge	Treated wastewater effluent from the City's WWTP is discharged to Marsh Creek at the following location: NAD83 Zone 3, North 2,175,205 feet and East 6,220,336 feet being within the SW ¼ of NE ¼ of Section 6, T1N, R3E, MDB&M
Purpose of Use:	<u>Present:</u> design average discharge from the WWTP is up to five (5) mgd of treated wastewater effluent to Marsh Creek; the current average dry weather influent flow to the WWTP is 3.7 mgd. <u>Proposed:</u> reclaim an annual average of 1.74 mgd, with a maximum of 1,946 acre-feet annually, of treated wastewater effluent for industrial use and landscape irrigation
Place of Use:	Proposed: 810 gross acres within the City of Brentwood city limits and Roddy Ranch Golf Course
Discharge Season:	January 1 to December 31 of each year
