Description of Proposed Changes:

The City of Thousand Oaks (City) proposes to reduce the minimum bypass flow in Permit 20952 from 6 cubic feet per second (cfs) to 2 cfs in Conejo Creek. This change will allow the City's partner agency, Camrosa Water District, to divert water from Conejo Creek more often for delivery to Pleasant Valley County Water District. Conejo Creek water will be used by Pleasant Valley County Water District to offset groundwater production, which will improve groundwater quality and reduce demand for State Water Project supplies. By lessening the demand for imported water from the State Water Project, the City's Project will lessen demand on Delta water supplies. The City proposes to reduce the bypass requirement in Permit 20952 from 6 cfs to 2 cfs through a Temporary Urgency Change Petition. This will make local groundwater supplies more reliable, reducing the need for State Water Project Supplies and will help alleviate demand for groundwater from an overdrafted basin.
