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ORDER APPROVING CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE, AND PURPOSE OF USE OF TREATED WASTEWATER

WHEREAS:

- Treated Wastewater change petition WW-18 was filed by the Simi Valley County Sanitation District on July 2, 1992 pursuant to Sections 1210 and 1211 of the California Water Code.
- 2. The change petition was filed with the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to obtain approval under Sections 1211 and 1700 of the California Water Code to change the place of use and purpose of use of 4.2 million gallons per day (4,700 acre-feet per year) of treated wastewater discharged from the Simi Valley Water Quality Control Plant in Ventura County.
- 3. The SWRCB has determined that good cause for the change has been shown.
- 4. The SWRCB has determined that the change does not constitute the initiation of a new right nor operate to the injury of any other lawful user of water.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The source of treated wastewater is the Simi Valley Water Quality Control Plant in Ventura County; within the NW½ of SW½ of Section 6, T2N, R18W, SBB&M.

2. The Purpose of Use shall be Irrigation and Industrial.

3. The Place of Use shall be within the City of Simi Valley's service area, as shown on a map filed with the SWRCB.

4. The water shall be limited to the quantity which can be beneficially used and shall not exceed 4,700 acre-feet per annum.
