Workshop Goals

- Clarify the purpose of the emergency regulations.
- Describe the content of the emergency regulations and answer questions.
- Collect public comments regarding water use reporting.
- Continue developing effective relationships between the Board and interested parties.

Purpose of the Emergency Regulations

The Clear Lake hitch population has been struggling for some time and the recent drought exacerbated the situation. Since 2014, the hitch has been listed as a Threatened species under the California Endangered Species Act, and the State Water Board is committed to helping communities and Tribes protect the hitch and maintain a healthy watershed. Currently, the Board does not have sufficient information about water use in the Clear Lake Watershed to understand how groundwater pumping influences creek flows. The emergency regulations would allow the Board to issue an information order to collect data from users in the Clear Lake Watershed to fill those data gaps. A map of the Clear Lake Watershed is included at the end of this document.


