Water Location. Notice is hereby Given that Martha M. Vasquez (formerly Martha M. Cooper) claims the water flowing in the Big Sur River to the extent of five thousand (5000) inches measured under a four inch pressure. That the purposes for which I, said Martha M. Vasquez, claim it, and the place of intended use, are as follows, to-wit:- I claim it for the purpose of supplying water for household, domestic, and mechanical uses. I also claim it for the purposes of generating and developing power, and for agricultural and irrigating purposes, at such point or points, between the points of diversion and the point of ultimate intended use of said water, as hereinafter set out. That the point of intended diversion is at a point in the Big Sur River about six hundred (600) feet " up stream from the point where the said river empties into the Pacific Ocean, and said point is designated by a post upon which this notice is posted, which post is upon the North bank of said Big Sur River, and about 10 feet distant therefrom. The point of intended use is upon the southerly part of Lot 1 of the El Sur Rancho, the same being part of what is known as the Big Sur Tracts. That the means by which I intend to divert said waters are by pumping from the said Big Sur River into a flume 24 inches wide by 14 inches deep, or by pumping into a six inch iron pipe. Water Location. Notice is hereby given, that I claim the water flowing in this the San Jose Creek to the extent of two hundred and fifty (250) inches, measured under a four inch pressure. That the purposes for which I claim it, and the places of intended use are, as follows I claim it for the purposes of supplying water for household and domestic and mechanical uses in the town site of Carmelito. I also claim it for agricultural and irrigating purposes, at such points or points between the points of diversion, that is to say (30) thirty feet from and adjacent to place of posting this notice which said notice is posted upon a burnt redwood stump situated within about (30) thirty feet of said creek upon the north side thereof and within about thirty (30) feet west of where the east line of the Fleming Ranch, crosses the said creek which crossing is found about (50) fifty feet from the Entrance gate to the Robinson Ranch - and about two (2) miles from the point where said creek discharges in the Pacific Ocean, and the ultimate point of intended use of said waters, to-wit; the town of Carmelito, and irrigation of land lying between point of diversion, and Point Lobos. The means by which I intend to divert the said waters, are by dam flume, and (12) twelve inch pipe. The flume to be approximately 18 inches x 18 inches, and the pipe approximately 12 inch in diameter. The dam to be of such
