

## Dear Mr. Baggett:

At the close of the hearing on May 1, 2002, the environmental organizations presenting coordinated cases-in-chief in Phase 2 were requested to provide a list showing the order in which they intend to present witnesses. That list is set forth below, with a note indication a potential change due to a scheduling conflict.

- 2. Dr. Stuart Hurlbert, Professor of Biology and Director of Center for Inland Waters, San Diego State University Ecology of the Sea.
- 3. Richard A. Vogl, Principal Hydrogeologist, HydroGeo Consultant, for Planning and Conservation League Contaminants in sediments.
