Sir:

In accordance with your instructions, I recommend that the lands hereinafter listed, be withdrawn from all forms of entry except those specifically excepted under the withdrawal acts (36 Stat., 847; 37 Stat., 497). This order of withdrawal (Public Water Reserve No. 90, California), involving approximately 104,240 acres, is recommended for submission to the President, in order that the lands affected thereby may be reserved for the purpose of creating a reservoir in Salton Sea for storage of waste and seepage water from irrigated land in Imperial Valley, California.

ORDER OF WITHDRAWAL  
PUBLIC WATER RESERVE NO. 90

Under and pursuant to the provisions of the act of Congress approved June 25, 1910 (36 Stat., 847), entitled "An act to authorize the President of the United States to make withdrawal of public lands in certain cases", as amended by act of Congress approved August 24, 1912 (37 Stat., 497), it is hereby ordered that the following described lands be, and the same are hereby, withdrawn from settlement, location, sale, or entry, and reserved for the purpose of creating a drainage reservoir in Salton Sea, California:
