Dear Mr. Long:

Thank you for your letter of June 12, 1964, concerning your License 659 to appropriate water from springs arising in Millard Canyon near Cabazon, California.

We have noted that your license report for the years 1961 through 1963 indicates that 2,000 gallons per day have been used throughout the year for stockwatering, irrigation, and domestic purposes. Following the May 4, 1964, inspection of the project, our field engineer reported that there has been no use during the last several years, except for possible stockwatering. The report was based on the engineer's personal observations and statements by Southern Pacific personnel who accompanied him.

We would appreciate any information that your office may have available that would be of assistance in clarifying the present situation regarding License 659.

On May 4, our field engineer also inspected the facilities covered by Application 554, License 660, and interviewed several persons in the Cabazon area. According to the resulting report, the water rights covered by License 660 have been transferred to the newly formed Cabazon County Water District. If this is the case, please have one copy of the enclosed notice of assignment duly executed and returned to this office.



subject:

Letter on file from Mr. Geo. Bailiff, tenant and actual user of water supply covered by License No. 659, shows distribution of water use appearing on report submitted for the year 1961 as between stock watering, domestic and irrigation. Figures for years 1962 and 1963 supplied by Mr. Bailiff were blanket estimates; however, it was assumed, in lack of evidence to the contrary, that the same proportion held good. Since this point has been raised, investigation will shortly be made. It now develops that Mr. Geo. Bailiff has died, but his son Bob is currently applying for a pasturage lease covering the same premises, for himself and his mother.

With regard to License No. 660, and transfer to Cabazon County Water District, Los Angeles Division, SP has been advised by the office of Mr. H. M. Williamson, Chief Engineer, San Francisco, that the San Francisco office will handle this matter directly with the State Water Rights Board in Sacramento.
