#### SUBJECT OF STATUS CONFERENCE

The Cities of Fairfield, Benicia and Vacaville (Cities) in coordinated Applications 30680, 30681, and 30682, respectively, propose to divert water from Barker Slough in the San Joaquin/Sacramento Delta Estuary, using available capacity of the existing Barker Slough Pumping Plant and the North Bay Aqueduct (NBA) of the State Water Project, for use in the Cities' service areas. On October 2, 2002, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) postponed the public hearing previously scheduled to commence on October 28, 2002, at the request of the Cities and the State Water Contractors. The deadline for submitting exhibits, which was September 20, 2002, was also postponed. The hearing was postponed in order to provide the Cities and the Department of Water Resources (DWR), which operates the State Water Project, with time to negotiate a resolution to protests against the water right applications by DWR.

On November 5, 2002, the SWRCB held a pre-hearing conference to hear reports from the parties and ask questions regarding the progress in negotiations between the Cities, the Department of Water Resources and the State Water Contractors. The parties provided an update on the negotiations and a schedule for executing water supply contracts between the Cities and the Department of Water Resources. The Cities anticipate withdrawing

Applications 30680, 30681, and 30682 after the water supply contracts are signed and all preconditions of the contracts are fulfilled.

On March 5, 2003, the SWRCB will hold a status conference with the parties to receive an update on the negotiations, the execution of water supply contracts and whether Applications 30680, 30681, and 30682 will be or have been withdrawn. If the applications are not withdrawn, the schedule for further proceedings will be a topic of the status conference. If the applications are withdrawn and no further issues remain, the status conference may be cancelled.

All parties who have previously filed notices of intent to appear in the hearing are requested to attend the March 5, 2003, status conference.

The status conference will be held at 2:00 p.m.
