Please be advised that an informal election was held in the Truckee-Carson Irrigation District on February 8, 1934 to enable the water users of the District to pass on the question of whether the Board of Directors of the district should recommend that the United States approve the Truckee River agreement. The result of this election was favorable to the question.

It is the present plan that representatives of the Truckee River interests affected will meet in San Francisco or Reno within the next few days to prepare a final draft of the agreement for submittal to the Department of the Interior.
