It is desired to protest against the approval thereof because to the best of OUR information and belief the proposed appropriation will result in injury to us as follows: It will deprive us of water that we are now using and have been using for irrigation, power generation, domestic use and other uses since the 21st day of May, 1903.

State the injury which will result to you

Protestant claims a right to the use of water from the source from which applicant proposes to divert, which right is based upon Appropriations made and notice posted on the Truckee River the 21st day of May, 1903 and the construction of irrigation works at a cost of \$5,000,000 to utilize this water.
Prior application, notice posted or use begun prior to December 19, 1914; riparian claim, etc.

The extent of present and past use of water by protestant or his predecessors in interest from this source is as follows: The water of Lake Tahoe and the Truckee River are now being used and have been used for the irrigation of 70,000 acres of land, the generation of power by 2 power plants and furnishing domestic water for 2 towns and the U. S. Navy Fallon Auxiliary Naval Station located near Fallon, Nevada.

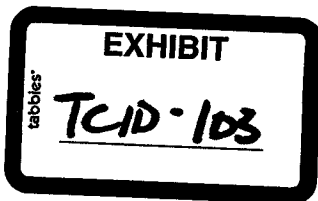

This protest may be disregarded and dismissed if it can be shown that the water lost by seepage and evaporation from this reservoir is taken from waters that may be allotted to California under the proposed Interstate Compact, and if it can be further shown that the use of water stored in this reservoir in the exchange of water stored in Lake Tahoe and thereby effecting the present operation of the gates at Lake Tahoe does not involve new and complicated legal questions in Lake Tahoe.

Are there any diversions on this stream, or stream to which it is tributary, below applicant's proposed diversion? If so, please give names and post office addresses of the users.
Diversions from main Truckee River (2 miles east of proposed Prosser Dam) are on record and are being adjudicated by the Calif-Nevada Interstate Compact Commission.
We find no present diversions on the 2 mile stretch of Prosser Creek below the proposed dam. See attached ^{letter} for recommendations on minimum water release from dam to protect and promote fish life and recreational values.
