Gentlemen:

This project (Prosser Reservoir) was discussed with the Bureau of Reclamation and various conservation officials in Carson City on March 27, 1958. We are in agreement with the minimum flow releases agreed upon among the Nevada and California Departments of Fish and Game, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Bureau of Reclamation, as reported in the Bureau of Reclamation "Prosser Creek Operation Study" dated January 14, 1958. This calls for "a minimum flow of 5 second feet - - - in Prosser Creek below - - - dam, except that only the natural flow of Prosser Creek at the dam would be maintained when the natural flow was less than 5 second feet - - - etc."

We concur with these recommendations and believe they will provide for adequate stream fishing in Prosser Creek, keeping in mind that a major purpose of the reservoir is enhancement of the Truckee River Fishery.
