- 4. In further answer to the Protest the Applicant alleges that there is unappropriated water in Prosser Creek available for appropriation for irrigation, fish culture, flood control, and recreational purposes and that it is such unappropriated water that the Applicant seeks to appropriate under Application No. 18006.
