I have read with alarm the proposed Draft Policy and how it will affect our Sea Ranch community. While the intentions are good for maintaining the river and stream life, it is wrong to propose a policy that might destroy this vital and historic community—one which has always lived with the land and is one of the touchstones of American architecture and community planning. It is one of the most environmentally concerned group of people on the planet, living in one of the best conceived developments ever built. It seems that this blanket policy does not fit the needs of our community, may destroy our water source, and thereby destroy property values.

I ask you to reconsider imposing this policy and consider the burden on us property owners and lovers of the North Coast. It is unfair to impose a policy to force us to pay for environmental impact and legal fees, to fight for our rights and property values. And a fight it will be should the dire predictions come to pass.

It is imperative that you delay any decision on this, that you increase your outreach to the citizens of our North Coast area, and that each case be studied carefully before implementing.
