4 Determination having been filed and heard by Thomas and  
5 Morag Fraser, Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Edward  
6 M. Beazley, Howard E. Graham, Richard M. Murphy, Jr.,  
7 Shasta Forests Company, Elmer Hufford, and Jesse D. Hufford,  
8 Jr.; the Board having filed its Supplemental Order of Deter-  
9 mination and moved the Court to amend and affirm the Order  
10 of Determination as amended; the matter having been sub-  
11 mitted for decision and the Court being fully advised in  
12 the premises grants the motion of the Board to amend the  
13 Order of Determination, affirms said Order of Determination  
14 as amended, and said Supplemental Order of Determination, and  
15 renders this its decree determining the rights of all parties  
16 involved in this proceeding as follows, to wit:

17 IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the  
18 several rights of all existing claimants in and to the use  
19 of water of the Cow Creek Stream System, excepting Clover  
20 Creek, Oak Run Creek, and North Cow Creek, in Shasta County,  
21 California, are as hereinafter set forth:

22  
23 Definitions

24 1. Water Code

25 The term "Water Code" means the State of California  
26 Water Code.

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1 watershed which it drains, from springs and seepage which  
2 naturally contribute to the stream, and from waste and  
3 return flow from dams, conduits, and irrigated lands, as  
4 distinguished from water released directly from storage  
5 for rediversion and use, or water imported from another  
6 watershed which is released directly to the natural  
7 channel for conveyance to place of beneficial use.

8  
9 6. State Water Resources Control Board Map

10 The State Water Resources Control Board map,  
11 hereinafter referred to as SWRCB map, is the map prepared  
12 by the Board from surveys made in 1964 and 1966, as  
13 revised and amended in 1968 and 1969, which map is  
14 entitled "Cow Creek Stream System, Excepting Clover  
15 Creek, Oak Run Creek, and North Cow Creek, showing  
16 Diversions and Irrigated Lands, Shasta County, California,  
17 dated 1964" and is on file in this proceeding. Said  
18 SWRCB map comprising five sheets, plus an index sheet,  
19 is by reference incorporated herein.  
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General Entitlement

7. Diversion and Use of Water

The several claimants in the proceeding are entitled to the use of water of Cow Creek stream system on their lands described under their respective names in Schedule 1, and shown on the SWRCB map, from points of diversion described in Schedule 2, during the periods of time specified in Paragraph 16, and in the amounts allotted from the various sources under the priorities and for the uses set forth after their respective names in Schedules 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 and Paragraph 21 and as said uses are defined in Paragraphs 17 through 20. The points of measurement of the amounts of water allotted shall be at the points of diversion from the stream system unless otherwise specified.

8. Reasonable Use

Nothing herein contained shall, or shall be construed to, allocate to any claimant a right to divert from Cow Creek stream system, at any time, a quantity of water in excess of an amount reasonably necessary for his beneficial use, nor to permit him to exercise his right in such a manner as to unreasonably impair quality of the natural flow.

1 9. Stream Groups

2 The rights to waters of the Cow Creek stream system  
3 are divided into four separate groups designated as follows:

4 Independent Tributary Group

5 Old Cow Creek Group

6 South Cow Creek Group

7 Lower Cow Creek Group

8 All rights in the Independent Tributary Group are superior  
9 in priority to and independent of all rights in the other  
10 three remaining groups, to wit, Old Cow Creek Group, South  
11 Cow Creek Group and Lower Cow Creek Group. All rights in  
12 each of the said remaining three groups are independent of  
13 rights in each of the other two of said remaining groups  
14 and all rights in Old Cow Creek Group and South Cow Creek  
15 Group are superior in priority to all rights in Lower Cow  
16 Creek Group excepting as provided in Paragraph 13.

17  
18 10. Classes in Independent Tributary Group

19 Rights in the Independent Tributary Group consist  
20 of the 10 Special Class rights which are entitled to divert  
21 the entire flow of the sources named at the points of  
22 diversion specified in Schedule 3, and rights in the  
23 Independent Tributaries which are shown in Schedule 7, con-  
24 sisting of 42 rights in First Priority Class, 12 rights in  
25  
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1 Second Priority Class, 5 rights in Third Priority Class and  
2 147 rights in Fourth Priority Class. Rights contained in  
3 said Schedule 7 are interrelated insofar as they attach to  
4 a common source designated therein. All rights in Schedule 7  
5 are inferior in priority to all Special Class rights in  
6 Schedule 3 but are superior in priority to all other rights  
7 on the Cow Creek Stream System except that rights in said  
8 Schedule 7 attaching to Glendenning and Atkins Creeks and  
9 their tributaries, except Spring Creek, are correlative with  
10 rights of the same Priority Class in Schedules 4 and 5  
11 attaching to these same sources.

12  
13 11. Classes in Old Cow Creek Group

14 Old Cow Creek Group consists of 48 rights in First  
15 Priority Class, 23 rights in Second Priority Class, 2 rights  
16 in Third Priority Class, 24 rights in Fourth Priority Class  
17 contained in Schedule 4, and 2 Surplus Class rights (Couser  
18 and Boksa) contained in Schedule 8. All rights in First,  
19 Second and Third Priority classes in said Schedule 4 are  
20 superior to and independent of all rights in the Lower Cow  
21 Creek Group as shown in Schedule 6. All rights to waters of  
22 Glendenning Creek and Tributaries in Schedule 4 in First,  
23 Second and Third Priority Classes are superior to all other  
24 rights in Old Cow Creek Group.

12. Classes in South Cow Creek Group

South Cow Creek Group consists of 31 First Priority Class, 23 Second Priority Class, 3 Third Priority Class, 7 Fourth Priority Class rights as shown in Schedule 5, and 1 Surplus Class right (Smith) shown in Schedule 8. All rights in First, Second and Third Priority Classes in said Schedule 5 are superior to all rights in the Lower Cow Creek Group as shown in Schedule 6.

13. Classes in Lower Cow Creek Group

Lower Cow Creek Group consists of 100 rights in First Priority Class, 56 rights in Second Priority Class, 6 rights in Third Priority Class, 46 rights in Fourth Priority Class contained in Schedule 6, and 5 rights in Surplus Class contained in Schedule 8. All rights in this Group are inferior in priority to all other rights on the Cow Creek Stream System except rights in Surplus Class and Fourth Priority Class. Said Surplus Class rights have a relative priority as defined in Paragraph 15. Rights in said Fourth Priority Class in Schedules 4, 5 and 6 are correlative.

14. Priority Classes

The term "priority class" when used herein means, except as expressly qualified with respect to certain



1 individual rights, a class of rights each one of which is  
2 equal in priority and correlative in right with all other  
3 rights of the same class appearing within the same schedule,  
4 so that in the event of a supply of water sufficient to sup-  
5 ply only part of the entitlement of any specific priority  
6 class, said available supply shall be prorated in accordance  
7 with allotments in that priority class. No priority class  
8 is entitled to the use of any water until all rights of all  
9 priority classes with lower numbers have been fully satis-  
10 fied. Thus, within the same schedule, all rights of the  
11 Second Priority Class are inferior in priority and sub-  
12 ordinate to all rights of the First Priority Class, but are  
13 superior in priority and entitled to full satisfaction ahead  
14 of the Third Priority Class, except power rights which will  
15 not impair the regimen and quantity of natural flow to which  
16 correlative and superior class rights are entitled.  
17 Claimants of irrigation rights for dormant riparian lands  
18 are entitled to divert allotments in Fourth Priority Class  
19 shown in Schedules 4 through 7, inclusive, to their places  
20 of use shown in Schedule 1, through proposed points of  
21 diversion specified in Schedule 2 or as these may be  
22 provided by claimant in the future to adequately divert  
23 water for irrigation of said lands without interference with  
24 superior rights.

15. Surplus Class Rights

Surplus Class rights shown in Schedule 8 are inferior in priority to Third Priority Class and superior in priority to Fourth Priority Class rights and are listed in relative order of their individual priority in said Schedule 8.

16. Seasons of Use

Allotments for irrigation shall be for continuous use from about March 1 to about October 31 of each year. Allotments for domestic, stockwatering, industrial and power purposes shall be for continuous use throughout the year.

17. Domestic and Stockwatering Use

Domestic use is limited to water applied exclusively for household purposes, watering of domestic animals and irrigation of up to one-half acre of yard, garden and/or family orchard. Use for stockwatering is limited to water required by commercial livestock. All allotments in First Priority Class in Schedules 4 through 7 are solely for domestic and stockwatering purposes.

18. Irrigation Use

Irrigation use is limited to the application of water for the purpose of meeting moisture requirements of growing crops.

19. Industrial Use

Industrial use is limited to the application of water in the culture and harvesting of timber including incidental domestic use, the building and maintenance of roads, sprinkling to allay dust, fire protection, operation of portable or semi-portable sawmills including operation and maintenance of appurtenant logging ponds, chippers and debarkers and the initial irrigation of timber plantings including Christmas tree stock. Use for stockwatering and domestic purposes by livestock and recreational users of timber lands in conjunction with, but not in excess of, the allotments contained herein for timber culture is deemed to be within this defined use.

20. Power Use

Power use is limited to the hydro-dynamic applications required for the development of electrical energy.

21. Combined Uses

Claimants diverting water under allotments for irrigation, industrial and/or power use are entitled to use water for domestic and stockwatering purposes incidental to the aforesaid major uses but are not entitled to divert in addition thereto their First Priority allotments for domestic and/or stockwatering use unless the supply available

1 under the inferior priority class allotment is insufficient  
2 to provide such incidental needs. In such event, the First  
3 Priority allotment is to be measured at the point of use;  
4 however, the aggregate of such allotment and the amount of  
5 carriage water required shall not exceed the maximum ditch  
6 rates for winter months as set forth below.

7 To provide water for conveyance losses and domestic  
8 and stockwatering purposes during the non-irrigation season  
9 from about November 1 to about March 1, all claimants with  
10 First Priority Class allotments are entitled to the amount  
11 of such First Priority Class allotments at their places of  
12 use during said winter months limited, in the aggregate, to  
13 the following maximum rates of diversion at the following  
14 specified points of diversion as described in Schedule 2:

22. Equivalent Flow to Provide Adequate Head

Although all quantities of water allotted to the several claimants for direct application to beneficial use in Schedules 3 through 8, inclusive, are severally expressed in terms of continuous flow, nevertheless, except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, nothing herein contained shall be construed as limiting or restricting the right of any such claimant to rotate in the use of water with other related rights in the same stream group or to divert for limited periods of time "heads" convenient for the specified purpose of use and thus apply water to his place of use at a greater rate than indicated by the quantity of continuous flow so allotted; provided that such practice of rotation or use of a convenient "head" shall not result in the use by any such claimant of a total quantity of water during any

thirty-day period in excess of the equivalent of claimants' continuous flow allowance; and provided further that such practice of rotation or use of convenient "heads" shall not cause an unreasonable interference in the regimen and quantity of available natural flow as defined in Paragraph 5 to which others are entitled; provided, further, that Pacific Gas and Electric Company and users of water through the following ditches are prohibited from exercising the rotation provision of this paragraph: the Grindlay-Williams, Diversion 6; the Brown-Grover Ditch, Diversion 28; the Koehler Ditch, Diversion 29; the Parker Hufford Ditch, Diversion 31; the Bassett Ditch, Diversion 36; and the German Ditch, Diversion 43. Subject to the foregoing impairment and infringement limitations, claimants entitled to take water through diversion works described in Schedule 2, including those entitled to generate hydro-electrical energy, who have, for regulatory purposes, maintained a tank or reservoir as described in Appendix A, titled Description of Diversion Systems, contained in the State Water Rights Board Report on Water Supply and Use of Water dated 1965, are entitled to continue such regulation as is necessary in the exercise of their rights granted herein.

#### Special Provisions

##### 23. South Cow Creek Ditch Association

The individual shareholders in the South Cow Creek Ditch Association own the German Ditch. The Association was originally known as the South Cow Creek Irrigating Ditch Company, being formed on October 6, 1887, with constitution and bylaws recorded in Book 4 of Miscellaneous Records

of Shasta County on page 263. Shareholders are entitled to divert and use waters of South Cow Creek in the amount and for the purposes set forth in Schedule 5 under Diversion 43 in proportion to their respective share ownerships in the said South Cow Creek Ditch Association as follows:

Non-shareholders Roger R. Cook and Ellen H. Turk are entitled to the use of German Ditch water from the allotment of Shasta Forests Company

1 as provided in Agreement (M)M54 with said company to be diverted at  
2 Diversion 66 for domestic and stockwatering use and irrigation of their  
3 lands described in Schedule 1. Non-shareholder State of California,  
4 Division of Forestry, is entitled to the use of German Ditch water through  
5 the easterly branch of the sixth lateral from the allotment of Shasta  
6 Forests Company as provided in its agreement with said Company for  
7 domestic and industrial uses incidental to the operation of the Whitmore  
8 State Forestry Station.

9 Pacific Gas and Electric Company by reason of its ownership of  
10 an additional 10 (ten) shares in the South Cow Creek Ditch Association is  
11 entitled to 2.00 cubic feet per second in Third Priority Class. Said 2.00  
12 cubic feet per second shall not be diverted by the Company through the  
13 German Ditch but shall be conveyed in the South Cow Creek Channel to  
14 Diversion 64 and shall be considered available for diversion at said point  
15 only after intervening rights of First and Second Priority Classes have  
16 been fully satisfied. Said Company may divert its allotment for 4.9  
17 shares in Second Priority Class through German Ditch, Diversion 43, in  
18 an amount of 1.44 cubic feet per second for discharge into Mill Creek and  
19 redirection therefrom through Mill Creek Ditch, Diversion 71, along with  
20 its allotment of 12.1 cubic feet per second in Third Priority Class from  
21 Mill Creek for conveyance and release into South Cow Creek Channel for re-  
22 diversion for power purposes at Diversion 64. In addition to the afore-  
23 stated allotments, said Company is entitled to divert 45.9 cubic feet per  
24 second in Third Priority Class from South Cow Creek through its South Cow  
25 Creek Powerhouse Ditch, Diversion 64, for power purposes as set forth in  
26 Schedule 5, and may divert up to 60.0 cubic feet per second from South Cow  
27 Creek through said ditch under this allotment, provided that all other senior  
28 and third priority rights are fully satisfied.
