### **NOTICE OF PETITION FOR TIME EXTENSION FOR WATER RIGHT PERMIT 20952 (APPLICATION 29408) OF CITY OF THOUSAND OAKS**

COUNTY: Ventura

STREAM SYSTEM: Conejo Creek

On December 15, 2025, City of Thousand Oaks filed a petition for a 15-year extension of time to complete construction work and beneficial use of water under water right Permit 20952 (Application 29408) with the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), Division of Water Rights (Division).

#### **Summary of Permit 20952 and Proposed Change:**

##### Sources:

- 1) Conejo Creek tributary to Calleguas Creek thence and Mugu Lagoon
- 2) North Fork Arroyo Conejo tributary to Conejo Creek

##### Points of Diversion:

- 1) North 1,899,728 feet and East 6,260,791 feet, located within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 32, Township 2 North, Range 20 West, SBB&M
- 2) North 1,900,529 feet and East 6,281,991 feet, located within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of projected Section 36, Township 2 North, Range 20 West, SBB&M

##### Season of Diversion:

January 1 to December 31 of each year

##### Amount of Water:

The diversion shall not exceed 21.7 cubic feet per second (cfs), up to a maximum of 15,683 acre-feet per year. The maximum rate of diversion at any time shall not exceed the sum of the following:

- (a) The real-time discharge from the Hill Canyon Waste Water Treatment Plant, (adjusted for flow time between the point of discharge and the point of diversion), less: 2.0 cfs for channel losses; and an additional 2.0 cfs to account for the dedication of treated wastewater for maintenance and protection of fish and wildlife pursuant to Waste Water Change Petition WW-6; and
- (b) An additional 4.0 cfs by direct diversion from January 1 through December 31 of each year at all times that the minimum bypass flow at the point of diversion is 6.0 cfs or greater (including the 2.0 cfs dedicated to fish and wildlife).

Purposes of Use:

Fish and Wildlife Preservation and Enhancement, and Irrigation

Place of Use:

***Irrigation:***

- within Camrosa Water District located within Township 1 North, Range 20 West, and Township 2 North, Ranges 18 through 20 West, SBB&M;
- within Pleasant Valley County Water District located within Townships 1 and 2 North, Range 21 West, SBB&M; and

***Fish and Wildlife Preservation and Enhancement:***

within the 6.7-acre Confluence Wetland located within the SE¼ of projected Section 36, Township 2 North, Range 20 West, SBB&M, as shown on the map filed with the SWRCB.

Time to Complete Beneficial Use:

***Existing:*** December 31, 2025

***Extension Requested with Petition:*** December 31, 2040

Pursuant to California Water Code section 1703.1, any interested person may file a protest to the proposed change. Protests filed in response to this notice should be submitted to the persons listed below and must be received by the Division by 4:30 p.m. on **May 15, 2026**. Protests may be provided via email prior to the deadline; however, a copy of the original signed letter of protest must be subsequently filed with the Division.
