Prudent management of water resources is the paramount issue for the world, our country, the state of California and the Lake Almanor Basin. Our decisions historically have threatened the ecological balance of watersheds everywhere. My most local concerns have to do with the effect of removing the coolest water from Lake Almanor with the purpose of lowering the water temperature downstream.
