Mr. Barnes:

My name is Dante' Perano and I have a home in the Lake Almanor Country Club. With great interest I have witnessed the concern of the community and my neighbors regarding the pending decisions on the Thermo Curtain.

I would like it to be noted that I believe the installation would not be in the best interest of the lake, town, recreational users, and fishermen. As you know, the lake is quite shallow and has a tendency to warm up in the summer months. In fact, jet skis suck up summer underwater growth near the bridge, which is produced by the existing warm water.

These significant changes to the character of this lake may have serious consequences. First off, consider the economics of the small town of Chester, which depends on people using the lake for recreation. If the water temperature should turn the fishermen away (most not caring for the taste of warm water fish) the local businesses will suffer even more than now.
